ORDER of the Local Government Board under "The District Auditors Act, 1879:" Addition of Union to Audit District :-

Kent Audit District. - Canterbury Union. To George Gibson, of Pencester-street, Dover, Gentleman ;-

To the Guardians of the Poer of the Canterbury Union, in the City and County of the City of Canterbury ; ~

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several parishes comprised in the said Union ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board, may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Audiors respectively are to act;

And whereas by an Order dated the 9th day of October, 1879, the Local Government Board certified the appointment of the said George Gibson as a District Auditor, and ordered and prescribed that the District within which he should in future act as Auditor, and which was thereby assigned to him, should, until the said Board otherwise prescribed, comprised the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in the Schedule to that Order, including the Canterbury Incorporation, and that such District should be termed "The Kent Audit District;

And whereas by an Order dated the 1st day of March, 1880, the Local Government Board ordered

The names of the Warrant Officers of the Bengal | and prescribed that it should be the duty of the said George Gibson to audit the Accounts of the Highway Boards for the Highway Districts of Cranbrook and New Romney, partly situate within the said Audit District, and of the officers of the said Highway Board, and that, for the purpose of such Audit, the said Highway Districts should be deemed to be within the said Audit District;

And whereas by a Provisional Order dated the 1st day of May, 1880, the Local Government Board directed that, from and after the 25th day of March, 1881, the Local Act passed in the first year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act for erecting a Workhouse in the City of Canterbury, for imploying and maintaining the Poor there, and for better enlightning the Streets of the said City; and the Local Act passed in the fifty-fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third intituled "An Act for altering, amending, and rendering more effectual an Act of the first year of King George the Second for erecting a Workhouse in the City of Canterbury, for employing and maintaining the Poor there, and for other purposes relating thereto," should be repealed;

And whereas the said Provisional Order was confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Poor Law) Act, 1880, and by Section 2 of that Act it was enacted that the Local Government Board, notwithstanding that the said Local Acts would not be repealed until the 25th day of March, 1881, might before that day form a Union to include, with or without other parishes, the parishes to which the Local

Acts applied;

And whereas by an Order dated the 11th day of February, 1881, the Local Government Board directed that, from and after the 26th day of February, 1881, the parishes to which the said Local Acts applied, and certain other Parishes should be united for the administration of the laws for the relief of the Poor, and form the Canterbury Union, in the City and County of the City of Canterbury;

And whereas it is expedient that the said Canterbury Union should be included within the said Kent Audit District:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Prescribe as follows:

ARTICLE I .- The area for the time being included in the said Canterbury Union shall, until We otherwise prescribe, be included in, and form part of, the said Kent Audit District.

ARTICLE II.—It shall be the duty of the said George Gibson, as the District Auditor for such District, to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their officers in conformity with the provisions contained in Article 3 of the first above cited Order, namely:

(1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the said Canterbury Union.

(2.) The Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in that Union.
