

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: making applicable to the Canterbury Union certain General Orders relating to Taxation of Bills (Poor Law): Vaccination: Proceedings under Bastardy Acts: Proceedings of Guardians under Elementary Education Act, 1876 (Inquiry Officers): "Attendance" at Workhouse Schools: School Fees by way of Loan: Relief of Orphan and Deserted Children: Financial Statement: Paupers' Conveyance Expenses:—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Canterbury Union, in the City and County of the City of Canterbury:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by an Order dated the 11th day of February, 1881, the Local Government Board ordered that the several Parishes therein mentioned should, from and after the 26th day of February, 1881, be united for the administration of the laws for the relief of the Poor, and form the Canterbury Union, in the city and county of the city of Canterbury:

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order that the provisions of the General Orders hereafter recited shall henceforth apply to and be in force in the Canterbury Union, namely:—

1. The General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners dated the twenty-first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, declaring the amount to be allowed to Clerks of the Peace for the taxation of Bills due to Solicitors in respect of business performed on behalf of any Parish or Union.

2. The General Order of the Poor Law Board dated the fifteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, prescribing the Form of Contract to be entered into for public Vaccination.

3. The General Order of the Local Government Board dated the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, prescribing the Forms of the Notices of requirement of Vaccination to be given by Registrars of Births, and the Forms of Certificates relating to Vaccination to be given by Public Vaccinators and Medical Practitioners.

4. The General Order of the Local Government Board dated the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, prescribing regulations with respect to the appointment of Vaccination Officers by Boards of Guardians, the tenure of office, duties, and remuneration of such Officers, and the institution and conduct of the proceedings under the Vaccination Acts, and the costs incurred in such proceedings.

5. The General Order of the Local Government Board dated the eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, prescribing Forms of Proceedings in Bastardy, upon the application of Guardians of the Poor.

6. The General Orders of the Local Government Board dated respectively the twenty-second day of March, and the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and the seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, prescribing regulations with respect to the proceedings of Guardians under the Elementary Education Act, 1876.

7. The General Order of the Local Government Board dated the twenty-seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, prescribing "attendance" of children at Workhouse Schools for the purpose of the Ele-

mentary Education Act, 1876, and the General Order of the said Board dated the third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, prescribing a Register of "Attendance" as regards Workhouse Schools.

8. The General Order of the Local Government Board dated the ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, authorising the allowance by Guardians, by way of Loan, of School Fees under the provisions of the Elementary Education Act, 1876.

9. The General Order of the Local Government Board dated the tenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, prescribing regulations with respect to the relief of orphan and deserted children.

10. The General Order of the Local Government Board dated the twenty-fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, prescribing the Form for the Financial Statement (Statutory) under "The District Auditors' Act, 1879," and Form for Return as to Loans.

11. The General Order of the Local Government Board dated the twenty-sixth day of February, 1880, prescribing regulations with respect to the expenses of the conveyance of paupers.

#### INCOME TAX.

#### INCOME TAX.

WHEREAS by the Taxes Management Act, 1880 (43 and 44 Vict., ch. 19), power is given for increasing in certain cases the number of persons appointed, under the provisions made by the Income Tax Act of 1842, Commissioners for the general purposes of the Income Tax, and persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners in each district or division in Great Britain; and it appearing to the Board of Inland Revenue that the number of persons so appointed for the division of Middle Holderness, in the East Riding of the county of York, is insufficien-
