From the Imperial Camp near Niffa, Sepred 6. The Express that was dispatcht with the first News of the figual Victory which it pleafed God to give us over the Energy on the 24 The ftant, went away in fo much harte, that I could not then fend you a particular Relation of this great Action, which thought came forcewhat later, will not, P and perforded, be now inacceptable to you. Not to trouble you with an account or our Marches, I will begin with telling you, That we arrived the 2 100 this Month about Four in the Afternoon, within a League of Niffs, where we found the Enemy very advantageoully politicd, their Camp reaching from the Intern to an adja-cent Hill, and being Fortified after the Modern way with good Interchinetiv, a deep Ditch and Palilladoes. Prince Louis o Biden thought it would be hazarding too thick to attack then on that fide, and therefore resolved to march round the Hill and to fall upon the back of their Camp, which he was informed was of much eather accels. The 24 by break of Day, we matched in order of Battle, Icaving the Hill on our Right The Enemy perceiving it, appeared in great Numbers upon the Hill, and having given a Volley, with a great cry of Aliah, Ar-fab, dilposed themselves according as they far us more. Some of their beft, Troops came down from the Hill, and advanced very bold y towards our frift Line, but being charged by Cze-ale's Hulfars, and leveral thair Pieces of Cannot being, brought to bear upon them, they were obliged to write. We took 29 Pieces of Cainon, all the Enemies Tents, and 3000 Horles and Mules, with a great deal of other Booty. The Energy were near treble our Number, for according to the molt moderate Complitation they were above 40000, and our Army confistent but of 15 or 16000 fighting Men.

Vienna, October 3. An Express froms Prince Louis of Baden patied through this place two Days ago, in his way to Ausbourg, with the great Standard, and feveral other Colours taken from the Turks in the late Battle at Niffa A The Lettershe brought from the Army inform us, That General Piccolomini, who was fent out with a Detachement of Horfe and Dragoons, had been as tar as Precopia, a large Town lying half way between Sophia and Nuffa, where he heard the Enemy were retired in great confution towards Adrianople. That he had pollefled himfelf not only of that place, but likewife of Pyro. Muftewa, Salanka, and Lofcoura, into all which he had put Garifons, and had commanded the Country people, who began to flee towards Sophia, not to leave their Houses, affuring them of Protection. That Prince Louis of Baden, upon this News, had fent General Piccolominia confiderable Reinforcement , And it was faid he would follow with the whole Arboy towards Sophian In the mean time the Imperialifts had begun to Fortific Nuffa.

a Ausbourg, Octob. 17. The Elector of Montz arrived here the 5th Initant with a Train it 500 perfors. The Elector Pa-latine will be here to Murrow, and the Electors of Trier, Brandenburg, Saxon and Bayaria are reported towards the end of this Month. Several Standards have been preferted to the Em-peror, which were lately taken from the 10 ks at Niffe. Francfort, Offold 20. The Electors of Bavaria and Saxony

are now at Hailbron, and most of their Vorces are quartered thereabouts. Yesterday passed by this place a Dejachement of Bavarian Foot, who are to be put into Garifon at Bm.

Bon, Oftob. 21. The Duke of Lorrain, with the Landtgrave of Heffe-Caffe', marched from hence the 17th Inftant with the Imperial Horfe, and the Troops of Heffe towards Francfort, and the Imperial Foot followed yesterday. The reft of the Forces that were employed in this Siege will break up the 24th, and it's faid that the Brandenburg Troops will take their Winter-Quarters in the Country of Luxemburg. The Marelchal de Lorge lies with the Forces under his Command at Echternach, near the Mojelle.

Hague, ORob. 25. The Army of this State was fill encamped on the 21 Inflant near Cambron. They had made leveral Efforts to engage the Mareschal d'Humieres in a Battle ; But he kept close in his Camp at Leuge till the 17th, when he decamped before break of Day, and retired towards Conde and Valenciennes, the Seafon not fuffering Prince Waldeck to follow him; fo that the Campagne feems to be at an end on that fide; And our Forces are preparing to go into their Winter-Quarters, which the greatest part of them are to have in Flanders, and will be to ordered that upon any occasion they may foon draw into a Body. The Adjutant-General Roley is come hither from the Elector of Brandenburgh to acquaint the States-General with his arrival at Cleves, and that his Electoral Highners intends, after having received the Homage of the States of that Country, to go to Ausbourg, where a Meeting is appointed of all the Electors, in order to the chufing a King of the Romans. We hear that there will be put a Bavarian Garifon into Bon Count Alsfelt, late Governor of that place, is faid to be dead of his Wounds.

Paris, Octob. 22.
