THE SCHLESWIG-HOLSTEIN ORDER OF 1881.

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 2nd of June, 1881.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

PRESENT:
Lord President.
Mr. Mundella.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as The Schleswig-Holstein Order of 1881.
2. This Order extends to England and Wales and Scotland only.
3. In this Order words have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.
4. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the tenth day of June, one thousand eight-hundred and eighty-one, and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.
5. Cattle brought from a port or place in either of the parts of the German Empire respectively known as Schleswig and as Holstein, (in this Order referred to as Schleswig-Holstein cattle,) and sheep and goats brought from Schleswig or Holstein in the same vessel with Schleswig-Holstein cattle, may be landed for slaughter in a foreign animals wharf, but not elsewhere.
6. The landing of Schleswig-Holstein cattle in a foreign animals wharf shall be subject to the

condition that they are accompanied by a declaration and certificates, such as are indicated in the forms in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect.

7. If the declaration accompanying any cattle imported under this Order is untrue in any particular, as regards any one of the cattle to which it relates, the master of the vessel shall be deemed guilty of an offence against The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878; with respect to all the cattle to which the declaration relates, unless he shows to the satisfaction of the Justices before whom he is charged, that he did not know of the same being so untrue, and that he could not with reasonable diligence have obtained that knowledge.
