Basford, in the county of Nottingham, except as follows :-

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the Church Cemetery burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the Church Cemetery as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

HANBURY.—Forthwith, and entirely in the parish church of Hanbury, in the county of Stafford; and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first of December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows:-

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every has coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such grave spaces in the churchyard as are reserved, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at

or below the depth of five feet.

Spondon.-Forthwith, and entirely in the parish church of Spondon, in the county of Derby; and also in the churchyard and in the Little cemetery, opened in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, except as follows: In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard and in the "Little Cemetery" burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

CHURCH GRESLEY.—Forthwith, and entirely in the parish church of Church Gresley, in the county of Derby; and also in the churchyard,

except as follows:-

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard as have never before been buried in, and, when opened, are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

CHIRK.—Forthwith, and entirely in the parish church of Chirk, in the county of Denbigh; and also in the churchyard after the thirtieth of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-

two, except as follows :-

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard as have never before been buried in and, when opened, are free from water burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted, as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

GLYNTAF.—Forthwith, and entirely (1) in the ecclesiastical district church of Glyntaf, in the parish of Eglwysilan, in the county of Glamorgan: (2) in that part of the churchyard which lies on the north of the church: (3) in that part which lies within four yards of the western boundary of the churchyard; and (4) in the rest of the churchyard, except as follows :-

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and children, as can be

buried at or below that depth.

St. Davids.—Forthwith, and entirely in the Cathedral Church of St. Davids, in the county of Pembroke: and also in the churchyard thereof, except as follows:—In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every cossin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

IBSTOCK.—Forthwith, and entirely in the parish

church of Ibstock, in the county of Leicester; and also in the churchyard, except as fol-

lows :-

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :-

(b.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard as have never before been buried in and, when opened, are free from water burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

Womersley.-Forthwith, and entirely in the parish church of Womersley, in the county of York; and also in the churchyard, after the thirty-first of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows :-

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that ever coffin buried therein be separately encloseby stonework or brickwork properly cemented

(b.) In partly walled graves now existir in the churchyard, provided that the ear above them can be opened to the depth five feet without exposing coffins or distur ing human remains, burials may be allow
