THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

### SCHEDULE.

An area comprising the parishes of Elford, Haselour, and Edengale, and the township of Harlaston, in the county of Stafford.

### THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease under the abovementioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or re-quired for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking) :-

Buckinghamshire. -(1.) The whole parish of Chesham, (including the hamlets of Ashley Green, Asheridge, Bellingdon, Botley, Char-teridge, Hundridge, Latimer, and Waterside,) the parish of Chesham Bois, and the parish of

Chenies, in the county of Buckingham. (2.) The whole of the parish of Marsworth, in the county of Buckingham.

Cambridgeshire .- The parishes of Waterbeach, Landbeach, and Cottenham, in the petty sessional division of Cambridge, in the county of Cambridge. '

(Liberty of the Isle of Ely).-The whole of the parish of Thorney, and that part of the parish of Wisbech, which is situate to the west of the Old South Eau Bank, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely.

Derbyshire.-(1.) The whole of the petty sessional

division of Derby, in the county of Derby, and the borough of Derby.

(2.) The petty sessional divisions of Ash-bourne, and Sudbury, in the county of Derby.

(3.) The parish of Crich, in the petty sessional division of Belper, in the county of Derby.

(4.) The petty sessional division of Swadlincote, in the county of Derby. (5.) The petty sessional division of Repton

and Gresley, in the county of Derby.

(6.) The park, grounds, and premises known as Egginton Hall, in the parish of Egginton, in the county of Derby.

Dorsetshire.-(1.) The parish of Owermoigne, in the petty sessional division of Dorchester, in the county of Dorset.

(2.) The tything and hamlet of Plush in the parish of Buckland Newton, and the higher tything of Piddletrenthide in the parish of Piddletrenthide, in the petty sessional division of Cerne, in the county of Dorset.

Hampshire.—(1.) Those portions of the parishes of North Stoneham, and South Stoneham, in the county of Southampton, which are bounded on the south-east by the river Itchen, on the south-west by the road leading from Wood Mill through Burger Street to the Upper Common Gate, on the west by the Winchester road as far as the lane opposite Messrs. Bull and Son's farm, and on the north and north-east by the road leading past the Bishopstoke railway station to the river Itchen.

(2.) That portion of the parish of Millbrook, in the petty sessional division of Southampton, in the county of Southampton, which is bounded on the south by the Southampton Water, on the east by the Shirley-road and the Romsey-road as far as the Old Toll Bar, on the north by Brownhill-lane and Redbridge-lane to the River Test, and on the west by the River Test.

(3.) The parish of North Baddesley, in the county of Southampton. (4.) All those fields on the north side of the

Stockbridge-road below the cottages called the Barracks to the end of Triendley's Wood, ex-tending north to the Warren Bottom Close part of Itchens Fields and part of the Glebe, including the bye-lane called Harridge Grove, and thence to the Stockbridge-road, in the parish of North Waltham, in the county of Southampton. Hertfordshire.-The petty sessional division of Watford, in the county of Hertford.

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Constantinople on the subject of quarantine, which is as follows :-

"Therapia, Sept. 12, 1881, noon.—Sanitary.— Following telegram sent this morning to Political Agent at Aden. Board of Health, 10th inst., ordered that arrivals from Aden, shores of Red Sea, and Gulf of Aden south of the 15th degree of latitude, proceeding to an Ottoman port, be required to call at Hodeidah, and submit there or at the Island of Caraman to quarantine. Should vessels from the above-mentioned shores arrive at Jeddah or elsewhere without having performed quarantine they would not be allowed to communicate, but would be driven back to Hodeidah. Warn vessels accordingly.—DUFFERIN."
