1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twentieth day of September, one

thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. The limits of the following area which is declared by order of Council dated the third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, to be an area infected with footand-mouth disease (namely),—the petty sessional divisions of Accrington, Blackburn Lower, and Clitheroe, in the county of Lancaster,—are hereby extended so as to include the area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

An area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Accrington, Blackburn Lower, and Clitheroe, in the county of Lancaster, and the borough of Clitheroe.

cept the whole of the southern division of the county of Leicester, and the borough of Leicester, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area or part of an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. The whole of the southern division of the county of Leicester, and the borough of Leicester, shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be an area or areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.
