Ni the 5th instant the Pope held an extraordinaty Congregation of State, to which were called the Cardinals City, Chigi, Alterr, Delfino, Hanillon, Colomas, Medicas, and Elfa. Dan Rietro Ottoboni, the Pope's great Nephew, who is about 73 years dld, has an Apartment in the Palace of the Vatican, and all Graits of Favoir are to pass through his hands. He vitited on the 13th instant the Spanish Ambassadors, the points of Ceremony, about which they had some dispute, being first setted through the Interposition of the Cardinal of Medicis. Signior Albani is confirmed in his place of Secretary of the Briefs; and Signior Secriponti in that of under Datary. And the Marquis Afalli and the Marquis Cavalieri are made Captains of the two Troops of Light Horse. The Pope's Coronation is put off till to morrew. off till to morrew.

Cadiz, Octob. 10. The 8th instant arrived in this Bay 4 Spanish Men of War, commanded by Don Nicolas de Gregorio; from Larache, which place is belieged by a numerous Army of Moors. Several Succours have been sent thinker, which got into the Town in Boats, with the loss of some Men, the Moors having raised two Batteries on the River. the River. Six Spanish Gallies are daily expected here from the Streights, with a farther Relief for that Garison,

which confifs at prefent of about 2000 Men.

Venice, Octob. 21. To morrow Prince Antonio Ottoboni, the Pope's Nephew, will make his publick Enry, to take Possession of the dignity of Procurator of S. Mark, to which he was Elected on the 14th instant by the unanimous Suffrage of the Senate: And several Triumphal Anches and other Preparations are making here on this occasion; in honour of the Pope. The Doge continues at Spalatro, to perform his Quarantain; He departed from before Napoli di Malvasia on the 14th of the last month, leaving that place blockt up by three Forts, which he had caused to be built, and having appointed several light Frigars to cruse on that Coast, to hinder their receiving any Relief by Sea. The Senate have named 12 Noble Venerians to go and meet the Doge, upon the first News

nemans to go and meet the Doge, upon the first News of his being on his way hither.

Milan, Octob. 19. The Troops of this State continue to affemble near Pavia, whither have been sent great Stores of Ammunition and Provisions, with a good Train of Artillery. We may now quickly expect to hear upon what Delign they will be employed. Several Troops are coming hither from Naples.

Vienna, Ottober 27. The Courier Mustapha Aga, who was in July last dispatch to the Port, returned hither on the other instant, with three other Turks in his Company. We shall now see what farther Proposals will be made by the Turkish Envoys, in order to a Peace. An Express from Prince Louis of Baden is just now passed through this place, with advice, That the Imperialists had descared a considerable Body of Turks that was posted near Widin, with the Slaughter of 2000 of them, and that they had afterwards taken that place by Storm.

Aubaurg, Ollob. 30. This Evening arrived here Court Forger from Bulgaria, with the News, That the Imp-rial Forces being advanted to Widin on the Danube, they found 10000 Turks polled near that place. That a turious Fight enfued, which ended, with the entire Defeat of the Enemy, who fled in Confution towards Philipspuli, leaving 1000 of their Men Hain inpon the place. And that the Imperiality afterwards wolk the Town of Widin by fre imperialits afterwards cook the Town of Wide by Storm, and the Callet by Capitulation. On our fide the Baron d'Orlock was killed, and General Veterant, and General Court Guido of Staremberg, wounded, the first dangerously; and about 700 men were killed and wounded in this Oscalion. The Emperor has appointed Commissioners to receive the farther Proposals of the Turkish Envoys at Vienna.

Hydelberg, Novemb. 2. Middleburg, Novemb. 1. The five Dutch East-India Ships (mentioned in our last) are come in with their two Prizes; which were taken in this manner. On the 26th of April, one of them, called the Normandy, bound home from Bengall, carrying 18 Guns and 49 Men, arrived at the Cape of Good Hope: The French, knowing nothing of the War, fent their Lieutenant affiore for fresh Provisions, where he and his Company were feized by the Dutch Governor, who manned the same Boat with his own Men, and sent it off again with French Colours, and ordered them, as they passed, to call upon the 2 Dutch Ships then in the Bay, the Netherlands, and the Samflag, and to give them notice of what had passed. They got immediately under Sail, and coming up with the French Ship, gave her a Broad-fide, which the French an five red; but having loft 13 or 14 Men, they yeilded. On the 5th of May arrived the other French Ship, called the Carofe, from Suratte, carrying 26 Guns and 94 Men, who prefently fent their Boat on Board the Normandy, which configured under French Colours; The two Dutch Ships bore up to her, and after fome Firing, the yeilded likewife, having last three men.
