Middleburg, Novemb. 1. The five Durch Eaft-India Ships ( mentioned in our last ) are come in with their two Prizes; which were taken in this manner. On the 26th of April, one of them, called the Normandy, bound home from Bengall, carrying 18 Guns and 49 Meh. arrived at the Cape of Good Hope: The French, know-ing nothing of the War, fent their Lieutenant affiore for trefh Provisions, where he and his Company-were feized by the Dutch Governor, who manned the fame Boat with his own Men, and lent it off again with French Colours, and ordered them, as they passed, to call upon the 2 Dutch Ships then in the Bay, the Netherlands, and the Samflag, and to give them notice of what had paffed. They got immediately under Sait, and coming up with the French Ship, gave her a Broad-fide, which the French abswered; but having lost 13 or 14 Men, they veilded. On the 5th of May arrived the other French Ship, called the Carofe, from Suratte, carrying 26 Guns and 94 Men, who prefently fent their Boat on Board the Normandy, which continued under French Colours; The two Dutch Ships bore up to her, and after fome Firing, the yeilded likewife, having loft three men.
