

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Lancashire, holden at Bolton.
In the Matter of William Fletcher, of Manchester-road, Wingates, Westhoughton, in the county of Lancaster, Builder and Provision Dealer, a Bankrupt.

Frederick Walter Briscoe, of No. 9, Chancery-lane, Bolton aforesaid, Accountant, has been appointed Trustee of the property of the bankrupt.
