(No. 194.)—ENGLAND—SOUTH COAST.

(1.) *Flashing Light on Anvil Point.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 152, of 19th August, 1881, on the intended exhibition of a light from a lighthouse then nearly completed on Anvil Point, nearly midway between the Bill of Portland and St. Catherine Point :—

The Trinity House, London, has given further notice, dated 29th September, 1881, that the light is now exhibited.

The light is a powerful flashing white light, showing a flash every ten seconds, visible seaward bearings of S. 85° 30' E. and S. 77° 30' W. It is elevated 149 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 18 miles.

(2.) *Shelmorlie Bank Buoy—Alteration in Character.*
