N the 13th instant the Pope was Crown'd, with the accustomed, Ceremonies: He faid Mafs himfelf; and afterwards fung Te Deam for the Victories obtained by

the Imperial Arms over the Turks; and concluded, having the Triple Crown on his Head, with giving the Benediction to the People. ١t being fignified, fome days before, to the Duke de Chaulnes, that he would not be allowed to appear at this Solemnity, 'till he had quitted the Franchifes of his Quarter; he declared, That he would not, during his ftay in this City, pretend to the faid Franchifes ; and was thereupon admitted to perform the usual Function as Ambassador of France. On the 19th the Pope held a publick Confiftory, and thanked the College of Cardinals for his Election. He has difposed of most of the vacant Benefices, having given his Great Nephew, Don Pietro, who inrends to enter into Ecclefiaftical Orders, the rich-Abby of Chiaravelle: And has named Signior Cantelmi to be his Nuncio to the Emperor, Signior Nicolini to Spain, Signior Santa Crece to Poland, and Signior Ranuccio Pallavicino to the Republick of Venice.

On Saturday last Prince Venice, Octob. 28. Antonio Ottoboni made his publick Entry as Procurator of Sr. Mark. We have advice, by Veffels arrived from the Levant, That Napoli di Malvafia is very closely block'd up by our Troops, and the Garifon reduced to great Necessity ; that Signior Pifani cruiles on that Coaft with 12 Ships; and that the Proveditor-General Cormaro was with the reft of the Fleet in the Port of Specia, about 30 Miles from Napoli di Malvafia.

From the Imperial Camp near Widin, Octob. 18. We decamped on the 6th inftant from Niffa ; and having paffed over high Hills, came, on the 7th, to the River Tinock, where we flay'd the 8th for our Baggage. The 9th we marched through a very narrow Pais to Stonice ; and the Regiment of Kiefel, kill'd. The fame day Prince toth to Breftaz. We refted on the 11th; on the 12th a Party, which had been font two days before towards Widin, return'd with leveral Priloners, who gave an account, That the Enemy had abandoned and burnt Orfowa, and Fietillau ; and that two Baffa's had posted themfelves with the Troops under their Command near Widin, but that Teckeley was retired towards Sophia : That day we advanced to Borgfelt; the 13th to Drenoua; on the 14th, in the morning we entered into the Plains of W.din, and our Right Wing having paffed three Stone Bridges over a Moras without any Body towards Hingary are, upon the News

opposition from the Enemy, drew up in Barralia not far from the Town, and there expected the coming up of our Left Wing : By this time the Turks had put themselves into a posture, and their Horie, being about 4000 ffrong, advanced, and charged our Left Wing, where Prince Leun of Baden was in Perfon; our Troops received them with great Vigor, and beat them back to the Intrenchments which they had lately made round the Town; but fome of our Squadrons, purfuing thein too far, were obliged, by the Fire of the Janifaries, that were posted there, to retire; though they, prefently after, advanced again, within 40 or 50 Paces of the Ditch of the faid Intrenchment, and kept their ground 'till the reft of the Left Wing was come up, and had advantageoufly posted hemfelves. In the mean time General Veterani, who commanded in the Right Wing, had ordered a Detachement of Foot and Dragoons to attack the Intrenchment towards the Water-fide, which they did, with such Bravery and Success, that they made themfelves Maîters of it, and of the Town; the Troops of the Left Wing, having likewife forced the Intrenchments, entered prefently after on the other fide, with a great Slaughter of the Enemy, of whom many, that endeavour'd to escape in Boats, were also drown'd in the Damibe. While this was doing, the Turkith Horfe. having paffed along the River-fide, fled rowards Sophia, but being purfued by four of our Regiments, they were forced to fight their way through the Troops that were coming up with our Baggage; and in this Rencontret divers of our Men were kill'd. Of the Enemy, who, at the beginning of the Fight, were 10000 ftrong, above 2000 were kill'd in this days Action : And on our file we had about 700 kill'd and wounded schole of chiefeft Note are General Veterani, and General Count Guido of Staremberg, wounded, but not dangeroufly i and the Baron of Orlick, and the Lieurenant-Colonel of the Louis fent a Summons to the Turks that were retired into the Caftle, but they pretending to defend it, on the 15th we opened Trenches in order to an Attack, and fent to Semandria for Cannon and Mortars; but this morning the Turks beat a Parly, and defired to be conducted, with their Goods, to Nicopolis, which was granted them; and to morrow they are to march our, being in all, with Women and Children, about 7000 Souls.
