WHEREAS the Town Council of the borough of *Huddersfield*, in the county of *York*, have presented a petition to Her Majesty stating that Orders in Council have been made directing the discontinuance of burials in the burial-grounds of the parishes of *Kirkheaton* and *Almondbury*, partly situate within the said borough, and representing that there is difficulty and inconvenience in providing, under the powers of the Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in the England beyond the limits of the Metropolis," and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," requisite places of interment for the inhabitants of the said parishes and borough; that the petitioners desire to be constituted a Burial Board pursuant to the Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make further provision for the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis," and praying that powers may be vested in the Town Council of the said borough of *Huddersfield* for providing places of burial under the provisions of the last above-mentioned Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such petition, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the tenth day of *December*, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be published in the *London Gazette*, and in one of the newspapers usually circulating in the borough of *Huddersfield*, one month at least before the said tenth day of *December*.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled

"An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-ground or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the *London Gazette*, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered: provided also, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir *William Vernon Harcourt*, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with certain modifications:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the twenty-sixth day of August last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the seventeenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in either of the under-mentioned parishes without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued (except as herein otherwise directed), as follows; viz.:

STAPLEFORD.—Wholly in Stapleford Church, in the county of Nottingham; and also in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, in which each coffin buried shall be separately entombed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and except in other graves which can be opened without the exposure of coffins or the disturbance of entire bones.

ROYTON.—Forthwith and entirely in Royton Church, in the county of Lancaster; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the Church Cemetery burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the Church Cemetery as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

HANBURY.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Hanbury, in the county of Stafford; and also in the churchyard, after the thirty-first of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows:

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every

coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and children, as can be buried at or below that depth :

(c.) In such grave spaces in the churchyard as are reserved burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

SPONDON.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Spondon, in the county of Derby ; and also in the churchyard and in the Little Cemetery, opened in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, except as follows :

In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard and in the " Little Cemetery " burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

CHURCH GRESLEY.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Church Gresley, in the county of Derby ; and also in the churchyard, except as follow* :

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard as have never before been buried in and, when opened, are free from water burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

CHIRK.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Chirk, in the county of Denbigh ; and also in the churchyard after the thirtieth of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows :

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and children, as can be buried at or below that depth :

(c.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard as have never before been buried in and, when opened, are free from water burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

GLYNTRAF.—Forthwith and entirely (1) in the ecclesiastical district church of Glyntraf, in the parish of Eglwysilan, in the county of Glamorgan ; (2) in that part of the churchyard which lies on the north of the church ; (3) in that part which lies within four yards of the western boundary of the churchyard ; and (4) in the rest of the churchyard, except as follows :

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

ST. DAVIDS.—Forthwith and entirely in the Cathedral Church of St. Davids, in the county of Pembroke ; and also in the churchyard thereof, except as follows :

In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

IBSTOCK.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Ibstock, in the county of Leicester ; and also in the churchyard, except as follows :

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard as have never before been buried in and, when opened, are free from water burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

WOMERSLEY.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Womersley, in the county of York ; and also in the churchyard, after the thirty-first of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows :

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In partly walled graves now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those already interred as can be buried at or below that depth.

MICHELMERSH.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Michelmersh, in the county of Hants ; and also in the churchyard, after the thirtieth of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows :

In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

ALSAGER.—Forthwith and entirely in Christ Church, Alsager, in the parish of Barthomley, in the county of Chester ; and also in the churchyard, except as follows :

(a.) In such walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the

depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

And whereas Orders in Council have been made directing the discontinuance of burials in the churchyards hereinafter mentioned from the time specified in such Orders; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyards be postponed:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyards be postponed as follows, viz.:—

In the churchyard of Burton Latimer, in the county of Northampton, to the first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

In the parish churchyard of Criccieth, in the county of Carnarvon, to the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

In the parish churchyard of Welwyn, in the county of Herts, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

In the parish churchyard of Ipstones, in the county of Stafford, to the fifteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Also forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Great Wigston, in the county of Leicester; and in the churchyard, except as follows:—In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Also forthwith and entirely in St. Wolstan's Church, in the parish of Great Wigston, in the county of Leicester; and in the churchyard after the thirty-first July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows:—(a) In such wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

SUTTON COLDFIELD.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Sutton Coldfield, in the county of Warwick; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—(a) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented: (b) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents, and children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

BRAMPTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Brampton, in the county of Huntingdon; and also in the churchyard, after the thirtieth June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows:—In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

BEAMINSTER.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Beaminster, in the county of Dorset; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—(a) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented: (b) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and unmarried children, as can be buried at or below that depth: (c) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard as have never before been buried in and, when opened, are free from water burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

OVER STOWEY.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Over Stowey, in the county of Somerset; and in the churchyard, after the first April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows:—(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are

now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented: (b) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard as have never before been buried in and, when opened, are free from water burials may be allowed of so many of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 203).—NORTH SEA.

(1.) *Schouwen Bank—Light-Vessel placed, and Bell Beacon Vessel withdrawn.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 181, of 26th September, 1881, on the proposed placing of a light-vessel on the inshore edge of Schouwen Bank—about 2 cables south-east of the Bell Beacon Vessel, which would then be withdrawn:

The Netherlands Government has given further notice, that on 23rd September, 1881, the light-vessel and watch buoys were placed in position, and the Bell Beacon Vessel was withdrawn.

The light is a triple-flashing light, showing three white flashes in quick succession every half-minute, elevated 36 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 11 miles. A riding light is also shown.

The light-vessel (composite wood and iron), painted red with broad white streak, and having the word "Schouwenbank" in black letters on her sides, is moored in 13½ fathoms water. The light apparatus is on the mainmast; by day a black ball is carried at the mast head; the vessel also has a jigger mast.

Position, lat. 51° 46' 55" N., long. 3° 26' 0" E.

In order to mark this position, two watch buoys, painted red with white band, and the letters (black) S. B. No. 1 and 2 on them respectively, have been placed—No. 1 to the westward distant one mile, in 8½ fathoms water; No. 2 to the northward distant 6 cables, in 8½ fathoms water, from the moorings of the light-vessel.

NOTE.—When from any cause, the flashing light cannot be exhibited, a fixed white lantern light will be shown from the mast head, and a white flare every ten minutes from above the gunwale.

When the light-vessel is not at her station, the usual lights will not be exhibited, but a fixed red light will be shown at each end of the vessel. By day a red flag will be hoisted above the black ball at the mast head.

Should a vessel be seen standing into danger, a

gun will be fired, and repeated if necessary; also, the signal flags J. D. of the International Code "You are in danger" will be hoisted and kept flying until answered.

A bright rocket immediately after a gun will denote that those on board require assistance from the shore.

All depths given are at ordinary low water.

NORWAY—WEST COAST.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board altering General Order relating to Election of Guardians:—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions and Separate Parishes named in Schedules A, B, and C to this Order;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order, dated the 14th day of February, 1877, the Local Government Board prescribed certain Regulations relating to the Election of Guardians of the Poor in the Unions and Separate parishes named in the said Schedules A and B; and Article 9 of the said Order contains the following proviso:

"Provided that whenever the day appointed in this Order for the performance of any act relating to or connected with the Election of Guardians shall be Sunday or Good Friday, such act shall be performed on the day next following, and each subsequent proceeding shall be postponed one day."

And whereas a similar proviso is contained in certain Orders of the Local Government Board addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Canterbury Union and the Guardians of the Poor of the Town of Plymouth, and bearing the dates specified in the said Schedule C;

And whereas it is expedient that the proviso above recited should be rescinded and another proviso substituted in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The above recited proviso in the said several Orders shall, from and after the date at which this Order shall come into operation, be rescinded.

ARTICLE II.—From and after the same date the following proviso shall be substituted in lieu of the proviso so rescinded:—

"Provided that whenever the day appointed for the performance of any act relating to the Election of Guardians shall be a Sunday or Good Friday, a Bank Holiday, or any day appointed for public fast or thanksgiving, such act shall be performed on the day next following, unless it is one of the days excluded as aforesaid, in which case the act shall be performed on the day following such excluded day; and, subject as aforesaid, the intervals between the dates fixed by the above-cited Orders for the several subsequent proceedings shall be preserved by a corresponding postponement of each proceeding."
