By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. The following areas (namely),—(1.) the parish of Braybrooke, in the county of Northampton, and (2.) the parish of Thorpe Lubenham, in the county of Northampton,—which were declared by Order of Council to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order,

cease to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. The following area declared by Order of Council to be an area infected with foot-andmouth disease (namely),—the parishes of Crick, Winwick, Watford, West Haddon, Guilsborough, and Nortoft, in the county of Northampton,—is, except the parishes of Crick, and Watford, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

4. The parishes of Crick, and Watford, in the county of Northampton, shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

5. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease. C. L. Peel
