“That the Overseers be and they are hereby instructed to apply to the Local Government Board, to issue an Order under their Seal, directing that so much of the Act “13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 57, entitled “An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry “or other Meetings in Churches and for “regulating the Appointment of Vestry “Clerks,” shall be put in force so far as regards the provision of accommodation for holding the Vestry Meetings within this township.”

And whereas the Overseers of the Poor of the said township of Tottington Lower End have made application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above Resolution :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows :

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry “or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding Vestry or other Meetings, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said township of Tottington Lower End.

ARTICLE II.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Overseers of the Poor of the said township.
