THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. The following area (namely),—the parish of Pertwood; so much of the parishes of Chicklade and East Knoyle as lies to the north of the road from Chicklade to Willoughby Hedge; and so much of the several parishes of Hill Deverill, Brixton Deverill, and Monkton Deverill, as lies to the south-east of the Deverill River, in the county of Wilts,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the thirteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

4. The township of Clayton-le-Dale, in the petty sessional division of Blackburn Lower, in the county of Lancaster, shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth-disease.

5. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

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1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

The following areas (namely),—(1.) the parish of Beswick, in the petty sessional division of North Hunsley Beacon, in the East Riding of the county of York; (2.) the parishes of Kilham, Middleton, Rotsea, and Sledmere, in the East Riding of the county of York; and (3.) all the lands and buildings situate at Bridlington, in the petty sessional division of Dickering, in the East Riding of the county of York, within the following boundaries, namely,—Marton-road, Sewerby Heads-road, Forty foot-lane, the Promenade, Chapel-street, Prospect-street, Quay-road, Saint John's-street, Kirkgate, and Pinfold-street, respectively; shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

THE Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the Albert Medal of the Second Class on—

MISS HANNAH ROSBOTHAM, 23 years of age, Assistant Schoolmistress, Sutton National Schools.

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the decoration is recommended:—

During a violent gale of wind on the 14th of October last, the stone belfry of the Sutton National Schools was blown down, and fell through the roof into the Infants' School-room (where nearly two hundred children were assembled), causing the death of one, and injuring many others, and filling the room and its gallery with stones, slates, and timber.

Whilst others fled for safety, MISS ROSBOTHAM (who at the time of the accident was teaching elsewhere) deliberately entered among the falling mass and cloud of dust; and, while fully conscious of the extreme danger to which she was exposed, remained on the spot until every child had been placed in safety.

At the imminent risk of her own life, MISS ROSBOTHAM removed four infants who were partially covered with the débris, and rescued therefrom a little girl who was completely buried, and who must inevitably have been suffocated had not such gallantry been displayed.

And whereas a new church has been erected within the said parish of Saint Oswald, Chester, and such new church has been consecrated and dedicated to Saint Thomas.

And whereas the said Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church at Chester are the patrons of the vicarage or incumbency of the said parish of Saint Oswald, Chester, and the Reverend William Henry Laurence Cogswell, Clerk in Holy Orders, is the present Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage or incumbency of the said parish

And whereas the Right Reverend William, Bishop of the said diocese of Chester, and the Very Reverend John Saul Howson, Doctor in Divinity, the Dean of the said Cathedral Church at Chester, acting as Dean on behalf of himself and the Chapter of the same Cathedral Church, as such patrons of the vicarage or incumbency of the said parish of Saint Oswald, Chester as aforesaid, and the said William Henry Laurence Cogswell, acting as such Vicar or Incumbent as aforesaid, have respectively certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, by an instrument under their hands bearing date on or about the sixth day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, that it will be for the convenience of the said parish of Saint Oswald, Chester, that the said new church of Saint Thomas, situate within the same parish, being duly consecrated as aforesaid, should be substituted for that portion of the said Cathedral Church at Chester (being the south transept as aforesaid) which as aforesaid has been accustomed to be used as the parish church of the same parish.

And whereas such substitution as aforesaid is contemplated by a certain Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the twenty-sixth, and published in the London Gazette on the thirtieth, day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, being an Order intended to provide for the more efficient performance of the duties of the Cathedral Church at Chester, and for the maintenance of part of the fabric of the same church; and in the same Order it is recited that such substitution was to be effected by us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, under the statute in that case made and provided.

cumbent of such church to any new church situate in the parish where such part of such cathedral is or is deemed to be the parish church; and by the same section it is further enacted that such new church shall, after such transfer, become the parish church in lieu of the former parish church so belonging to such cathedral.
