By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. The following area (namely),—the parish of Pertwood; so much of the parishes of Chicklade and East Knoyle as lies to the north of the road from Chicklade to Willoughby Hedge; and so much of the several parishes of Hill Deverill, Brixton Deverill, and Monkton Deverill, as lies to the south-east of the Deverill River, in the county of Wilts,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the thirteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. The following areas (namely),—(1.) the townships of Aighton Bailey and Chaigley, Bowland with Leagrim, and Thornley with Wheatley, in the petty sessional division of Clitheroe, in the county of Lancaster, and (2.) the townships of Alston, Elston, Grimsargh with Brockholes, and

Hothersall, in the county of Lancaster,—which were declared by Orders of Council to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. The following area declared by Order of Council to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the townships of Balderstone, Dutton, Osbaldeston, and Clayton-le-Dale, in the petty sessional division of Blackburn Lower, in the county of Lancaster,—is, except the township of Clayton-le-Dale, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

4. The township of Clayton-le-Dale, in the petty sessional division of Blackburn Lower, in the county of Lancaster, shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth-disease.

5. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.
