

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Lancashire, holden at Manchester. In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against Henry Bagge, of the Balmoral Restaurant, Queen's-buildings, Deansgate, in the city of Manchester, Restaurant Keeper.

UPON the hearing of this Petition this day, and upon proof satisfactory to the Court of the debt of the Petitioner, and of the trading, and of the act or acts of the Bankruptcy alleged to have been committed by the said Henry Bagge having been given, it is ordered that the said Henry Bagge be, and he is hereby, adjudged bankrupt.—Given under the Seal of the Court this 12th day of December, 1881.
