HE Letters from Lemberg of the 7th Inftant tell us, That the Troops of Lithuania were gone home, and thole of Poland into their Winter-Quarters, which were appointed as near the Frontiers as conveniently could be, to fecure the Country against the Incursions of the Tartars. The King is expected here towards the end of this Month, and then, it's faid, the Circular Letterswill be fent out for the fuminoning a Dyet to meet here in the beginning of December. Some of our Froops that were fent out towards Caminice, have defeated a Party of Turks, and taken 34 Prifoners.

Vienna, Ottob. 31. The laft Letters from the Imperial Camp near Widin, which are of the 13th of the laft Month, faid, That 'twas believed they floud march from thence towards Nicoplia, to make themfelves Mafters of that Place, before they went into their Winter-Quarters. A German Officer, who had been two Years a Priloner at Cani/a, and was later franforn'd, being come hither, reports. That there was ftill in that Place a Garilon of 2000 Men who feemed refolved to defend it to the late extremity. They write from Upper Hungary, That the Imperial Troops which block up Great Waradin, had taken two Wagons laden with rich Goods, which the Inhabitants of that Place were fending to Transitrania.

Ausbourgh, ORob. 25. On the 18th Inftant the Efector Palatine made his publick Entry into this City, with a numerous Train. And the Electors of Bavaria and Trier are daily expected: Though we do not here that the time is yet fixed for the meeting of the Electors, in order to chule a King of the Reman. ^c Francfort, Novemb 6. We hear from Aubying that a Marriage is propoled between Prince James, Eldett Son of the King of Poland, and the Princels Ekzabeth, Fifth Daughrer of the Elector Palatine. There is likewife much difcourie of a Marriage between the Electoral Prince, Eldeft Son of the faid Elector, and the Infanta of Portugal. The Troops of Heffe have their Winter Quarters in Wetteravia, and thole of Saxony about Afchaffenburg, the Bergftraat, and Hailbron.

Cologne, Novemb, 8. The States of this Diocels are now affembled, and have, amongft other Matters, in Confideration the demolifning the Outworks of Bon, though it's believed they will come to no Refolution therein, till the arrival of the Bavarian Troops that are to remain in Garilon there. They write from Trier of the fifth Inflant, That the Marefchal de Lorge and the Marquifs de Boufflers, after having viewed the Fortifications, parted from thence on the third towards Luxomburg.

Nimeguen, Novemb. 2. The Dutch Troops that were employed in the Siege of Ben, are marching this way; The Regiment of Lanoy is expected here this Evening; That of Nymbergen goes to Aernbens, That of Dilwich to Swol; And that of Slamgenburg to Zutphen. A great many Vellels are likewife palled by this place with Cannon and Ammunition.

Wesel, Novemb. 7. Their Electoral Hignessen of Brandenburg began their Journey on Samuday last rowards Berlin. The Brandenburg Troops that were before Bon are gone into their Winrer Quarters.

Chifter, Novemb. 11. The French Papifts, that were brought Priloners from Ireland, and have been fince kept in the Caftle
