Warsaw, Octob. 15.

THE Letters from *Lemberg* of the 7th Instant tell us, That the Troops of *Lithuania* were gone home, and those of *Poland* into their Winter-Quarters, which were appointed as near the Frontiers as conveniently could be, to secure the Country against the Incursions of the Tartars. The King is expected here towards the end of this Month, and then, it's said, the Circular Letters will be sent out for the summoning a Dyet to meet here in the beginning of *December*. Some of our Troops that were sent out towards *Caminiec*, have defeated a Party of Turks, and taken 34 Prisoners.

Vienna, Octob. 31. The last Letters from the Imperial Camp near *Widin*, which are of the 15th of the last Month, said, That 'twas believed they should march from thence towards *Nicopolis*, to make themselves Masters of that Place, before they went into their Winter-Quarters. A German Officer, who had been two Years a Prisoner at *Canisa*, and was lately ransom'd, being come hither, reports, That there was still in that Place a Garison of 2000 Men, who seem'd resolv'd to defend it to the last extremity. They write from *Upper Hungary*, That the Imperial Troops which block up *Great Waradin*, had taken 100 Wagons laden with rich Goods, which the Inhabitants of that Place were sending to *Transilvania*.

Ausbourg, Octob. 25. On the 18th Instant the Elector Palatine made his publick Entry into this City, with a numerous Train. And the Electors of *Bavaria* and *Trier* are daily expected: Though we do not here that the time is yet fix'd for the meeting of the Electors, in order to chuse a King of the *Romans*.

Francfort, Novemb. 6. We hear from *Ausbourg* that a Marriage is propos'd between Prince *James*, Eldest Son of the King of *Poland*, and the Princess *Elizabeth*, Fifth Daughter of the Elector Palatine. There is likewise much discourse of a Marriage between the Electoral Prince, Eldest Son of the said Elector, and the Infanta of *Portugal*. The Troops of *Hesse* have their Winter Quarters in *Wetteravia*, and those of *Saxony* about *Aschaffenburg*, the *Bergstrat*, and *Hailbron*.

Cologne, Novemb. 8. The States of this Diocess are now assembled, and have, amongst other Matters, in Consideration the demolishing the Outworks of *Bon*, though it's believed they will come to no Resolution therein, till the arrival of the *Bavarian* Troops that are to remain in Garison there. They write from *Trier* of the fifth Instant, That the *Mareschal de Lorge* and the *Marquis de Boufflers*, after having view'd the Fortifications, parted from thence on the third towards *Luxemburg*.

Nimeguen, Novemb. 2. The Dutch Troops that were employ'd in the Siege of *Bon*, are marching this way; The Regiment of *Lanoy* is expected here this Evening; That of *Nynbergen* goes to *Aernhem*; That of *Ditrich* to *Swol*; And that of *Staugenburg* to *Zutphen*. A great many Vessels are likewise pass'd by this place with Cannon and Ammunition.

Wesel, Novemb. 7. Their Electoral Highnesses of *Brandenburg* began their Journey on Saturday last towards *Berlin*. The *Brandenburg* Troops that were before *Bon* are gone into their Winter-Quarters.

Chester, Novemb. 11. The French Papists, that were brought Prisoners from *Ireland*, and have been since kept in the Castle
