THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eleventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. The limits of the following area which is declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-third day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the whole of North Fen from Gold Dike on the east to Falls Drove on the west, and the whole of Ruff Fen from Mill Drove on the west to a point where Green Drove joins French Drove, including all the above-mentioned Drovers, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely,—are hereby extended so as to include the area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease. *C. L. Peel.*

SCHEDULE.

An area comprised within the following limits, that is to say, commencing at Falls Drove on the west and proceeding to Singlesole, thence along Harley Drove to the Old Wryde Drain, thence along such Drain to Gold Dike, thence along such Dike to the Old South Eau to Falls Drove aforesaid, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely.

2. So much of the Order of Council bearing date the second day of January, one thousand eight

hundred and eighty-two, as declares the parish of Spratton, in the county of Northampton, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby revoked: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date when this revocation takes effect, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.

3. The following areas (namely),—(1.) the parish of Byfield, in the county of Northampton, and (2) the parishes of Moreton Pinkney, and Canon's Ashby, in the county of Northampton, which were also declared by the said Order of Council to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease. *C. L. Peel.*

SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1882, AMENDMENT.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as THE SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1882, AMENDMENT.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

3. Notwithstanding anything in The Scotland (Movement of Animals) Order of 1882, no animal shall be moved by land or by water from any place or port in England or Wales to any place or port in Scotland. *C. L. Peel.*

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES
(ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

Buckinghamshire.—(1.) All inclosures of land in the county of Buckingham adjoining the following place declared to be a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the whole of the field called Lower Westall, in the parish of Whitchurch, in the occupation of Henry Brazier, and the several inclosures of land adjoining thereto, and all buildings standing on such inclosures, —on the northern and eastern sides thereof, and also all the land in the occupation of the said Henry Brazier situated in the said parish of Whitchurch on the southern side of the road leading from Whitchurch to Oving;

(2.) So much of the township of Great Horwood, in the county of Buckingham, as lies to the south of the farm there, in the occupation of John Denchfield, and to the east of the road leading from Great Horwood to Winslow.

Cambridgeshire (Isle of Ely).—The whole of North Fen from Gold Dike on the east to Falls Drove on the west, and the whole of Ruff Fen from Mill Drove on the west to a point where Green Drove joins French Drove, including all the above-mentioned Drovers, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely.

Cornwall.—(1.) The parish of Mylor, in the county of Cornwall.

(2.) The parish of Budock, in the county of Cornwall.

Cumberland.—The petty sessional division of Bootle, in the county of Cumberland.

Essex.—The parishes of Tilty, Broxted, Great Easton, Little Easton, Thaxted, Chickney, and Takeley, in the county of Essex.

Hampshire.—(1.) Those portions of the parishes of North Stoneham, and South Stoneham, in the county of Southampton, which are bounded on the south-east by the river Itchen, on the south-west by the road leading from Wood Mill through Burger Street to the Upper Common Gate, on the west by the Winchester road as far as the lane opposite Messrs. Bull and Son's farm, and on the north and north-east by the road leading past the Bishopstoke railway station to the river Itchen.

(2.) The whole of the parish of East Tytherley, in the petty sessional division of Romsey, in the county of Southampton.

Lancashire.—(1.) The township of Clayton-le-Dale, in the petty sessional division of Blackburn Lower, in the county of Lancaster.

(2.) The township of Samlesbury, in the petty sessional division of Blackburn Lower, in the county of Lancaster.

Lincolnshire (Holland).—All lands comprised in a district in the parishes of Fleet, Gedney, Holbeach, and Whaplode, or some of them, in the Elloe division of the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, and intersected almost midway in a line drawn from south-west to north-east of such district by Neals Gate road, and bounded by Ravens Bank from Saturday Bridge through Ravens Clough along Ravens Dyke in a southward direction, down Jiggles Gate to Jiggles Hurn towards the north and east, by the Fen-dyke-road leading from Jiggles Hurn due west

along Joys Bank north of Fleet Lots to Jiggles or Jerkins Bank to the Plough Inn towards the south, and by Ravens Gate running due north from the Plough Inn up to Saturday Bridge aforesaid towards the west.

So much of the county of Oxford as is bounded on the north by the borough of Banbury, on the east by the river Cherwell, on the west by the main road from Banbury through Bloxham to the road which leads from Bloxham to Adderbury, on the south by the last-named road to its junction with the Deddington and Banbury road at the eighteenth milestone, and thence in an easterly direction by the Banbury and Deddington road as far as the south corner of Adderbury Park, and thence by the tributary stream to the river Cherwell; such roads as are defined as boundaries not being included within the area.

(2.) The borough of Banbury.

said parish of Arlington, in the occupation of Edward Shoosmith; the whole of the Camberlott farm, in the said parishes of Hellingly and Arlington, in the occupation of John Deverell; the whole of Clifton farm, in the said parishes of Hellingly and Arlington, in the occupation of James Brotherhood; so much of the lands in the occupation of Robert Gutsell, at the Upper Dicker, as lie on the north-west side of the road leading from Berwick Station to the Upper Dicker; the whole of the lands in the occupation of Samuel Gutsell, in the said parish of Arlington; the whole of the lands in the occupation of William Wood, situate at the Dicker, in the said parish of Hellingly, and the whole of the lands in the occupation of James Wheatley, situate at the Upper Dicker in the said parish of Arlington; in the county of Sussex.

(2.) The whole of Leabridge farm, in the parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of Mary Ann Heaver; the whole of the Broad farm, in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of Reuben Message; the whole of Lealands, in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of E. Neville; so much of the Shaw Pits farm in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of Spencer Piper, as lies west of the river; the whole of the Holmbush farm, in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of Cornelius Fox; the lands of Globe farm, in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of William Burt; and the lands of Stonehouse, in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of Mary Ann Heaver; in the county of Sussex.

(3.) The whole of the marsh lands lying in Pevensey Level, within the parishes of Pevensey, Westham, Heistmonceux, Hailsham, and Wurtling, in the county of Sussex.

(4.) The whole of Watkins Down farm, in the parish of Heathfield, in the occupation of Henry Edwards; the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of Richard Walters, in the parish of Warbleton; and the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of Messrs. Dallaway Brothers, in the said parish of Heathfield; in the county of Sussex.

corner of the Anthony Hill Tower field, thence in a direct line to the south-eastern front of the Eastbourne Gas Works, and thence in a direct line to the sea.

ARTICLE 2.—The application for a Certificate of Registration of any Work shall contain the following particulars:—

(a.) The description of the Work, and its name, if any.

(b.) The Parish or Place where the Work is carried on.

(c.) The date when the Work was erected.

(d.) If the Work is closed, the date when it was closed.

(e.) The name and address of the owner, lessee, occupier, or other person carrying on the Work.

ARTICLE 3.—The application for a Certificate shall be addressed to the Local Government Board

and sent by post to or delivered at the office of the Board.

ARTICLE 4.—If the application is in due form, and in the case of a Work erected after the first day of January, 1882, or which has been closed for a period of twelve months, the Work is found to be furnished with such appliances as are required by Section 12 of the said Act, a Certificate in the Form A. set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be issued by the Local Government Board upon the receipt by them of a Post Office Order for the amount of the Stamp Duty payable thereon under the said Act, such Order to be made payable to the Postmaster General at the Parliament Street Post Office, Whitehall, London, S.W.

ARTICLE 5.—Where any change occurs in the Ownership of a Work, or in any other particulars stated in the Register, and written notice thereof is given to an Inspector in accordance with the

the provisions of the said Act, the Inspector shall forward such notice to the Local Government Board and the Register shall be amended by inserting such alteration accordingly, and an endorsement shall be made by the Local Government Board on the Certificate in accordance with the Form B. set forth in the said Schedule.
