1. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

SCHEDULE.

An area comprising so much of the parish of Swanbourne, in the county of Buckingham, as lies to the east of the road leading from Swanbourne Church to the Aylesbury and Winslow main road at the boundary of Hoggeston parish, and to the south of the road leading from Swanbourne Church through Mursley to Leighton Buzzard.

The following area (namely),—the parishes of Tilty, Broxted, Great Easton, Little Easton, Thaxted, Chickney, and Takeley, in the county of Essex, — which was declared by Order of Council to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.
