The limits of the following area which is declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-third day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—all lands comprised in a district in the parishes of Fleet, Gedney, Holbeach, and Whaplode, or some of them, in the Elloe division of the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, and intersected almost midway in a line drawn from south-west to north-east of such district by Neals Gate-road, and bounded by Ravens Bank from Saturday Bridge through Ravens Clough along Ravens Dyke in a southward direction, down Jiggles Gate to Jiggles Hurn towards the north and east, by the Fendyke-road leading from Jiggles Hurn due west along Joys Bank north of Fleet Lots to Jiggles or Jerkins Bank to the Plough Inn towards the south, and by Ravens Gate running due north from the Plough Inn up to Saturday Bridge aforesaid towards the west,—are hereby extended so as to include the area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

(ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.
