THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of January, one

thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2: The limits of the following area which is declared by Order of Council dated the twentythird day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),-all lands comprised in a district in the parishes of Fleet, Gedney, Holbeach, and Whaplode, or some of them, in the Elloe division of the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, and intersected almost midway in a line drawn from south-west to north-east of such district by Neals Gate-road, and bounded by Ravens Bank from Saturday Bridge through Ravens Clough along Ravens Dyke in a southward direction, down Jiggles Gate to Jiggles Hurn towards the north and east, by the Fendyke-road leading from Jiggles Hurn due west along Joys Bank north of Fleet Lots to Jiggles or Jerkins Bank to the Plough Inn towards the south, and by Ravens Gate running due north from the Plough Inn up to Saturday Bridge aforesaid towards the west,-are hereby extended so as to include the area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with footand-mouth disease. THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease under the abovementioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):-

Buckinghamshire.—(1.) All inclosures of land in the county of Buckingham adjoining the following place declared to be a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the whole of the field called Lower Westall, in the parish of Whitchurch, in the occupation of Henry Brazier, and the several inclosures of land adjoining thereto, and all buildings standing on such inclosures, -on the northern and eastern sides thereof, and also all the land in the occupation of the said Henry Brazier situate in the said parish of Whitchurch on the southern side of the road

leading from Whitchurch to Oving.
(2.) So much of the township of Great Horwood, in the county of Buckingham, as lies to the south of the farm there, in the occupation of John Denchfield, and to the east of the road leading from Great Horwood to Winslow.

(3.) So much of the parish of Swanbourne, in the county of Buckingham, as lies to the east of the road leading from Swanbourne Church to the Aylesbury and Winslow main road at the boundary of Hoggeston parish, and to the south of the road leading from Swanbourne Church through Mursley to Leighton Buzzard.

Cambridgeshire (Isle of Ely).—An area comprised within the following limits, that is to say, commencing at Falls Drove on the west and proceeding to Singlesole, thence along Harley Drove to the Old Wryde Drain, thence along such Drain to Gold Dike, thence along such Dike to the Old South Eau to Falls Drove aforesaid, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely.

Wash, such part of the parish of Deeping Saint Nicholas as lies in the Parts of Holland, and such parts of the parishes of Cowbit, and Spalding, as lie on the western side of the river Welland, (the whole area being bounded by such river on its eastern side,) in the Elloe division of the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire.

Neville; so much of the Shaw Pits farm in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of Spencer Piper, as lies west of the river; the whole of the Holmbush farm, in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of Cornelius Fox; the lands of Globe farm, in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of William Burt; and the lands of Stonehouse, in the said parish of Hellingly, in the occupation of Mary Ann Heaver; in the county of Sussex.

(3.) The whole of the marsh lands lying in Pevensey Level, within the parishes of Pevensey, Westham, Herstmonceux, Hailsham, and

Wartling, in the county of Sussex.

(4.) The whole of Watkins Down farm, in the parish of Heathfield, in the occupation of Henry Edwards; the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of Richard Walters, in the parish of Warbleton; and the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of Messrs. Dallaway Brothers, in the said parish of Heath-

Eastbourne Gas Works, and thence in a direct line to the sea.

Worcestershire. - So much of the parish of Chaddesley Corbett, in the county of Worcester, as lies on the northern side of the main road leading from Kidderminster to Bromsgrove.

Yorkshire (East Riding).—The parishes of Middleton, and Sledmere, in the East Riding of the county of York.

Yorkshire (North Riding).—The townships of Kirbymoorside, and Welburn, in the North Riding of the county of York.
