THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fourth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

SCHEDULE.

An area comprising the divisions of Low Quarter and Middle Quarter and a portion of Kirkby Moor bounded on the north by the road from Beanthwaite to Garthwaite, in the township of Kirkby Ireleth, in the petty sessional division of Lonsdale North, in the county of Lancaster.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fourth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. The limits of the following place which is declared by Order of the Executive Committee of the Local Authority for the county of Bucking-ham, dated the eleventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),-the field known as Windmill Field with the cow-shed standing thereon, situate in the township of Great Horwood, in the county of Buckingham, in the occupation of Alfred Willmer, and the two arable fields adjoining the said Windmill Field, and in the respective occupations of George Henry Harrup and the said Alfred Willmer, - are hereby extended so as to include the place described in the Schedule to this Order, and the place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease. SCHEDULE.

A place comprising the field known as Windmill Field with the cow-shed standing thereon, situate in the township of Great Horwood, in the county of Buckingham, in the occupation of Alfred Willmer, and the two arable fields adjoining the said Windmill Field, and in the respective occupations of George Henry Harrup and the said Alfred Willmer, together with so much of the public road leading from Great Horwood to Winslow as adjoins thereto.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Animals brought from the port of Boulognesur-Mer in France shall not be landed in England or Wales or Scotland.

2. In this Order words have the same meaning as in The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

3. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.
