1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. #### TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 6th proximo, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Act 40 Vic., cap. 2, to the amount of £1,476,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 10th day of February, 1882, and will be payable at three or six months after date (at the option of the persons tendering), viz.:—on the 10th May, or 10th August next, respectively.

of England not later than three o'clock, on Friday, the 10th proximo.

FURTHER Regulations made by the Public Works Loan Commissioners under the Public Works Loans Act, 1875.

I. The fees or sums to be paid by the applicants pursuant to Section 41 of the Public Works Loans Act, 1875, in respect of loans on rates shall not exceed the following sums, viz.:—

On loans not exceeding £2,000, £1 1s. for every £100 of such loan; on loans exceeding £2,000 and not exceeding £25,000, £2 1s. plus 2s. 6d. for every £100, by which such loan exceeds the sum of £2,000; on loans exceeding £25,000, £50.

Where a loan is advanced by instalments secured by one deed, there shall be paid in respect of each advance after the first, an additional fee of £1 1s. for every £100 of such advance, but not exceeding £3 3s.

For the purpose of this Regulation the total amount to be advanced under one security deed shall be considered as a loan, and fractional parts of £100 shall be considered as £100.

In addition to the above fees, the applicants shall pay the stamp duty, counsel's fees, and other disbursements incurred by the Loan Commissioners in respect of the several applications.

In respect of all business not being a loan on rates, the fees or sums payable shall be fixed by the Commissioners, regard being had to each particular case.

II. The above Regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of February, 1882, and as from such date the Regulation No. 7 of the Regulations made by the Public Works Loan Commissioners on the 1st day of April, 1876, shall be rescinded.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.
