Agricus, Octob. 3.

The *Bashaw* who lately made the Peace with the French, apprehending some ill Treatment on account thereof from the *Levant* Camp at their return, on the 27th past deserted the Government, and fled into the Mountains; and on the 29th *Shahin Hoga* was made Governor

Cadix, Octob. 24. On the 22th instant arrived here a Bark from *Larache*, with an Account that the Moors continued the Siege with a great deal of Conduct and Method; That they had made a Breach, and had assaulted the place, but were repulsed by the Belieged with considerable Loss. The Governor has sent hisher for more Succours; and 300 Men are Embarked on a Spanish Man of War, which will sail out of this Bay with the first fair Wind. The like number is going from *Cyprus*; and several Spanish Gallies are daily expected here from the *Levant*, with a farther Relief for that place, which begins to be in some danger.

Venice, Novemb. 6. Several Vessels are arrived here this Week from the *Morea*, which confirm the News we had received before, by the way of *Zant*, of our Gallies having taken two Gallies that were going with Succours to *Napoli di Malvasia*; which place continues very closely blocked up. Commissions are daily given out for new Livies, and other Preparations are making here for a vigorous Prosecution of the War against the Turks. The Letters from *Rome* of the last instant tell us, That Cardinal *Barrucchi*, Archbishop of *Gnesna*, and Primate of *Poland* arrived there on the 27th past. That the French Ambassador had his first publick Audience of the Pope on the 28th, as the Ambassador of *Malta* had the same day. That the 29th the Marquis *de Cogolud*, Ambassador of *Spain*, had a private Audience of the Pope; and that it was believed his Excellency would appear publicly on the 4th of this Month, being the Feast of *St. Charles*. That on the 31 the Prince of *Calatraz* performed the usual Homage in the name of the King of *Spain*, for the Kingdom of *Naples*. And that it was thought the Pope would, on the 7th instant, hold a Conistory, to make a Promotion of Cardinals.

Genoa, Novemb. 8. We hear from *Milan*, That the Duke of *Mantua* had consented to the Demolishing the Fortifications of *Castella*; and that the Troops of the *Ambanese* were thereupon going to decamp from *Casalmaggiore*. Yesterday arrived here a Prince of *Newbourg*. He has been complimented on the part of the Republick; and two Gentlemen are appointed to shew him the Curiosities of this place.

Warsaw, Octob. 21. The Forces of this Crown, as well as those of *Polandia*, are gone into their Winter Quarters. The Court continues at *Quetta*, from whence the King will take a Journey to *Zolkiew*, to visit that and other Frontier places, before he returns hither; and in the mean time Pretensions are making for the meeting of the Diet. The News of the Death of the Cham of *Tartary* is confirmed from several places; as is likewise that of the return of the Tartars that were marching towards

Hungary. They write from *Bilacoffen*, That the *Moscovites* are preparing to enter into the *Krimea* in the Spring, with very numerous Forces; and that the Czars have appointed another General to command them, in the place of the Prince *Galitzen*, who is in Disgrace, being accused, amongst other things, of having even had private Intelligence with the Tartars. An Express is arrived here with Letters from the Emperor to the King of *Poland*, giving an account of the Victories lately obtained by the Imperial Forces over the Turks in *Seravia*.

Ausbourg, Novemb. 13. The Elector of *Bavaria* is gone for *Munick*, after having had several Conferences with the Imperial Ministers; but his Electoral Highness intends to return hither, together with his Brother the Elector of *Cologne*, towards the end of this Month; about which time the Elector of *Trier* is likewise expected. The last advices from *Hungary* are, That the Castle of *Widin* was surrendered to the Imperialists the 19th past, and the Garrison conducted to *Nicopolis*. That Prince *Louis of Baden* had given Orders for the fortifying the Town, and the raising, in order thereunto, several new Works on both sides the *Danube*. That he had sent the Count of *Sblich* to the *Hospodar* and States of *Valachia*, to regulate the Contributions and Provisions which they are to furnish for the use of the Imperial Troops that are to have their Winter Quarters on that side, and to let them know, That if they made any difficulty in this matter, he should be obliged to send part of the Army to force them to a Compliance therein. The same Letters say farther, That the Garrison of *Temeswar* was reduced to great necessity.

Brandenburg, Novemb. 11. The *Brandenburg* Minister at the Dyet has given in a Memorial concerning the matter of the Succession to the Estate of the late Duke of *Saxe-Lauenburg*, which he desires they will forthwith take into Consideration, that all occasion of Difference between the several Pretendents thereunto may be speedily taken away. The Emperor has approved the Resolution of the Dyet for the removing the Imperial Chamber, formerly established at *Spire*, to *Wistlar*; and several Princes of the Empire are nominated Commissioners for adjusting every thing relating to this Affair.

Franckfort, Novemb. 13. The Duke of *Lorraine* arrived at *Innsbruck* on the 7th instant. The French Troops that were posted near *Landau*, under the Command of the Marechal of
