The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will

observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEES TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His Majesty King William the fourth chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her present Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eight years of Her present Majesty chapter sixty-three and of the Bishoprick of Saint Albans Act 1875 and of the Bishopricks Act 1878 duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in the words and figures following, that is to say;—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His Majesty King William the fourth chapter seventy-seven and of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of your Majesty chapter sixty-three and of the Bishoprick of Saint Albans Act 1875 and of the Bishopricks Act 1878 have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for dividing the Archdeaconry of Rochester and Saint Albans and for constituting an Archdeaconry of Rochester and providing a temporary endowment for the same.

“Whereas by virtue of an Order of your Majesty in Council bearing date the eighth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five and duly published in the London Gazette of the twentieth day of the same month which Order was made partly in pursuance of the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore-mentioned Act the then Archdeaconry of Rochester became on the avoidance of the same by the death of the Venerable Walker King on or about the nineteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine suppressed.

“And whereas by the third section of ‘The London Diocese Act 1863,’ being the Act of the twenty-sixth and twenty-seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-six the provisions of the said Order of your Majesty in Council were repealed so far as respected the archidiaconal jurisdiction over the city and deanery of Rochester and by the same section the full and exclusive jurisdiction of an archdeacon within and over the whole city and deanery of Rochester and all parishes and places situate within the limits of the said city and deanery was vested in and made exerciseable by the then Archdeacon of Saint Albans and his successors and it was by the same Act and section enacted that the same archdeacon should be styled ‘The Archdeacon of Rochester and Saint Albans.’

“And whereas by the second section of the said last-mentioned Act it was provided that on a

contingency which has since happened certain parishes situate in the counties of Kent and Surrey or one of them but not situate within the city or deanery of Rochester aforesaid should be transferred from the diocese of London and become and form part of the diocese of Rochester and should become subject to the same archidiaconal jurisdiction as the other parishes situate in Kent and belonging to the See of Rochester (to wit those parishes which were and are situate within the city and deanery of Rochester aforesaid) were at the passing of the same Act or might thereafter become subject to, that is to say to the archidiaconal jurisdiction of the Archdeacon of Rochester and Saint Albans aforesaid.

“And whereas by the ninth section of the said Bishoprick of Saint Albans Act 1875, sub-section two; power is specifically reserved to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England to divide the Archdeaconry of Rochester and Saint Albans either upon the then next avoidance of the same archdeaconry, or (if the person who at the time of the passing of the same Act was archdeacon of that archdeaconry should consent to such division) before such avoidance.

“And whereas the Venerable Anthony Grant was at the time of the passing of the said last-mentioned Act and is still archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Rochester and Saint Albans.

“And whereas the said Anthony Grant is willing and desirous that the said Archdeaconry of Rochester and Saint Albans shall now be divided in manner hereinafter appearing but so nevertheless that the canonry in the Cathedral Church of Rochester heretofore held by him first as Archdeacon of Saint Albans and thereafter as Archdeacon of Rochester and Saint Albans shall in manner contemplated by ‘The Bishopricks Act 1878’ aforesaid continue hereafter to be so held by him so long as he shall hold the Archdeaconry of Saint Albans and in order that the said division may be effected the said Anthony Grant has tendered in writing to the Bishop of the diocese of Rochester his resignation of the office and place of an archdeacon over that part of the said archdeaconry of Rochester and Saint Albans which now remains within the diocese of Rochester and the said Anthony Grant has also executed this scheme as hereinafter appears.

“And whereas the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson the Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester has accepted such resignation by the said Anthony Grant as is aforesaid and in testimony thereof has executed this scheme as hereinafter appears.

“And whereas the Right Reverend Thomas Legh Bishop of Saint Albans, is consenting to this scheme in respect of so much thereof as affects the diocese of Saint Albans and in testimony of such consent has executed this scheme as hereinafter appears.

“Now therefore with the consent of the said Anthony Grant in testimony whereof he has set his hand and seal to this scheme and with the consent of the said Thomas Legh Bishop of Saint Albans in testimony whereof he has set his hand and his episcopal seal to this scheme and with the consent of the said Anthony Wilson Bishop of Rochester in testimony whereof he has also set his hand and his episcopal seal to this scheme we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose as follows that is to say:

“I. From and after the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette

the Archdeaconry of Rochester and Saint Albans shall be divided by separating from the same the whole city and deanery of Rochester and all parishes and places situate within the limits of the said city and deanery and the other parishes and ecclesiastical districts situate in the counties of Kent and Surrey or either of them which by the London Diocese Act aforesaid were placed (as from the then next avoidance of the See of Rochester) within the diocese of Rochester.

"II. The same parishes and districts so situate within the city and deanery of Rochester as aforesaid and the same parishes and districts so situate in the counties of Kent and Surrey aforesaid or either of them which became under the provisions of the said London Diocese Act as aforesaid, and now are part of the diocese of Rochester shall upon and from the day of publication aforesaid together constitute and become and be one archdeaconry by the name of 'The Archdeaconry of Rochester' and the rural deans and other the clergy and inhabitants of the said Archdeaconry of Rochester shall be wholly under and subject to the archidiaconal jurisdiction authority and control of the Archdeacon of Rochester for the time being who shall have and exercise all the rights powers and duties of an archdeacon within the limits of the Archdeaconry of Rochester aforesaid.

"III. So much of the said Archdeaconry of Rochester and Saint Albans as is within the diocese of Saint Albans shall upon and from the day aforesaid again become and be known as the same was known before the passing of the said London Diocese Act 1863 as 'The Archdeaconry of Saint Albans.'

"IV. An annual sum of two hundred pounds shall be paid by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the person who shall be appointed Archdeacon of Rochester for time being, such payment to commence as from the day of his being so appointed to the same archdeaconry and continue only until the day when the canonry in the cathedral church of Rochester which is now held by the said Anthony Grant shall cease to be so held and in the meantime be apportionable between any avoiding archdeacon of Rochester (or his representatives) and his successor in the same archdeaconry and be payable in respect of any one year only after due evidence furnished to us that any legal conditions as to the residence of an archdeacon have been during that year complied with by the archdeacon in whose favour the payment is to be made.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the said Acts or any of them or with any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester and also by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint Albans.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter sixty; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter sixty; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Baptist situate within the limits the new parish (some time district chapelry) of Saint Mary Penzance in the county of Cornwall and in the diocese of Truro.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Baptist situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint Mary Penzance as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward White Bishop of the said diocese of Truro (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Mary Penzance which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint John the Baptist situate within the limits of such new parish as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John the Baptist, Penzance.'

"And with the like consent of the said Edward White Bishop of the said diocese of Truro (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials, should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint John the Baptist situate within the limits the new parish of Saint Mary Penzance as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty

will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The District Chapelry of Saint John the Baptist Penzance being :—

“All that part of the new parish of Saint Mary Penzance in the county of Cornwall and in the diocese of Truro which is bounded on the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the parish of Madron in the said county and diocese from the new parish of Saint Mary Penzance aforesaid at a point in the middle of the road commonly known as the Madron-road which leads from the Penzance Cemetery, into Penzance the said point being a little to the north-east of the house called or known as Saint Clare, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of six and a half chains or thereabouts to a point at or near to the gate at the southern end of the roadway leading to the house called or known as Trencere upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mary Penzance from the new parish of Saint Paul Penzance in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence first northward then eastward and then generally southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of fifty-one chains or thereabouts to the point in the town of Penzance where the same boundary diverges in a westerly direction from the middle of the street called or known as Causeway-head and extending thence that is from the same boundary south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction at the eastern end of the Green Market with the road or footway called or known in one part as the Market-place and which leads past the north-western side of the Market-house to Market Jew-street and extending thence that is, from the last-described point of junction north-eastward along the middle of the last-described road or footway for a distance of six chains or thereabouts thereby passing in one part along the north-western side of the Market-house as aforesaid and in another part passing along the north-western side of Market Jew-street aforesaid to a point opposite to the middle of the north-western end of Jennings-street and extending thence south-eastward across the said Market Jew-street to and along the middle of Jennings-street aforesaid for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to the south-eastern end of the last-named street on the western side of the harbour and continuing thence still south-eastward and in a direct line to the eastern boundary of the said new parish of Saint Mary Penzance at the entrance to the said harbour all which hereinbefore described part of the new parish of Saint Mary Penzance aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining sides other than upon the south-west as aforesaid as follows that is to say upon the east by the sea and around the north by the parish of Madron aforesaid.”

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and

Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Truro. *C. L. Peel.*

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis,” it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-ground or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by another Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England,” it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned, ten days' previous notice of his in-

tention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that he is of opinion that the Orders of Her Majesty in Council affecting burials in the said parishes should be varied in the following manner:—

ISLEWORTH.—The Order in Council of the seventh April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four: by the omission of the words “with the exception of family vaults and graves only one body to be buried in each grave,” and by the substitution of the words, except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the new portion of the churchyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the new portion of the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those already interred therein as can be buried at or below that depth.

HORSHAM.—The Order in Council of the twelfth December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, by the omission of the words, “except in now existing vaults and brick graves which can be opened without disturbing soil that has been already buried in, in which each coffin shall be embedded in a layer of powdered charcoal four inches thick, and be separately entombed in brick or stonework properly cemented; and except, also, in the south-west portion thereof, as marked by boundary stones, in graves which can be opened without digging up buried remains, no coffin to be buried within a foot of any other coffin, or less than four feet beneath the surface,” and by the substitution of the words, “except in now existing vaults and wholly walled graves which can be opened without disturbing soil that has been already buried in, in which each coffin shall be embedded in a layer of powdered charcoal four inches thick, and be separately entombed in stonework or brickwork properly cemented.”

BILSTON.—The Order in Council of the nineteenth October one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, by the omission of the words “except in such now existing vaults and walled graves as can be opened without the disturbance of soil which has been buried in, and in which each coffin shall be embedded in powdered charcoal and be separately entombed in an air-tight manner,” and by the substitution of the words “forthwith and entirely in the Baptist chapel and chapel-yard, Bilston, in the parish of Wolverhampton, in the county of Stafford:” the words “in the Baptist chapel burial-ground” being also omitted.

EDMONTON.—The Order in Council of the twelfth December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, by the omission of the words “within five yards of the church, and in the rest of the churchyard except in graves not less than five feet deep, which can be opened without the exposure of coffins, no grave which has been buried in to be reopened unless to bury another member of the same family,” and by the substitution of the words “after the first September one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled

graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz.: widows, widowers, parents, children, brothers and sisters, as can be buried at or below that depth.”

SEDFIELD.—The Order in Council of the thirty-first July one thousand eight hundred and eighty, by the omission of the words “except in existing vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in earthen graves, five feet deep, which can be opened without the exposure of coffins or of undecayed bones. And none but the families of those already buried to be interred” (the words “those portions of” being inserted between the words “in” and “Sedgefield” at the beginning of the Order), and by the substitution of the words “that lie within eight feet of the church and of any dwelling-house; and also in the rest of the churchyard except as follows:

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains (small dry bones being excepted) burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein viz.: widows, widowers, parents and unmarried children, as can be buried at or below that depth.”

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twenty-seventh day of March next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation one month before the said twenty-seventh day of March.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

Buckinghamshire.—(1.) So much of the township of Great Horwood, in the county of Buckingham, as lies to the south of the farm there, in the occupation of John Denchfield, and to the east of the road leading from Great Horwood to Winslow.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," the killing and taking of wild birds were prohibited for the time between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in each year, and by the 8th section power was given to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as to Great Britain, upon the application of the Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled of any county, to extend or vary the time during which the killing and taking of wild birds, or any of them, was prohibited by the said Act, such extension or variation to be made by Order of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State :

And whereas the Justices of the county of Essex, in Quarter Sessions assembled, have applied to me to the effect that an Order should be made directing that the time during which the killing and taking of all or any wild birds is prohibited shall be varied in the county of Essex, so as to be from the 15th day of March to the 1st day of August, during the present year :
