Dalloway Brothers, in the said parish of Heathfield; in the county of Sussex: and (5.) the whole of the Rock Hill farm, in the parish of Heathfield, in the occupation of David Edwards; the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of William Cornford, in the said parish of Heathfield; the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of George Harmer, in the said parish of Heathfield; the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of William Hayward, in the said parish of Heathfield; the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of Henry Hayward, in the said parish of Heathfield; the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of John Richardson, in the said parish of Heathfield; the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of Arthur Pont, in the parish of Burwash; the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of Daniel Hobden, in the said parish of Burwash; the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of John Hawes, in the said parish of Burwash; the whole of the farm and lands in the occupation of Luke Mann, in the said parish of Burwash; and the whole of the lands in the occupation of George Taylor, in the said parish of Burwash; in the county of Sussex,—which were declared by Orders of Council to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

Buckinghamshire.—(1.) So much of the township of Great Horwood, in the county of Buckingham, as lies to the south of the farm there, in the occupation of John Denchfield, and to the east of the road leading from Great Horwood to Winslow.

(2.) So much of the township of Great Horwood, in the county of Buckingham, as lies between the road leading from Great Horwood to Winslow, and the brook known as Wigwell Brook, commencing at the point where it crosses the said road near the village of Great Horwood, and continuing thence to the point where it falls into the Wash Brook which separates the township of Great Horwood from the parish of

Addington, and also so much of the township of Great Horwood as lies to the eastward of the said road and is in the occupation of Frederick Denchfield.

(3.) The whole of the parish of Grandborough, in the county of Buckingham.

Cambridgeshire (Isle of Ely).—An area comprised within the following limits, that is to say, commencing at Falls Drove on the west and proceeding to Singlesole, thence along Harley Drove to the Old Wryde Drain, thence along such Drain to Gold Dike, thence along such Dike to the Old South Eau to Falls Drove aforesaid, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely.

Cornwall.—(1.) The parish of Mylor, in the county of Cornwall.

(2.) The parish of Budock, in the county of Cornwall.

(3.) The parish of Sancreed, in the county of Cornwall.

(4.) The parishes of Gwinear, and Crowan, and those portions of the parish of Camborne which lie to the southward of the Cornwall Railway, in the county of Cornwall.

(5.) All the lands in the borough of Helston which lie within the following limits, that is to say, from the point on the south-west of the highway leading from Helston to the Lizard at the junction of the parishes of Wendron and Mawgan-in-Meneage outside the farm called Content, along the same road in a south-easterly direction to the cross roads at Dodson's Gap, (excluding the said highway,) and from thence by the highway to Gweek on to the four cross roads between Menehay and Trevenen-in-Wendron, (excluding the said highway,) and from thence by the dis-turnpiked road to Helston through Wendron-street and Coinage-hall-street down by the main road to the river Cober, (excluding the said roads, streets, and highway,) and from thence along the said river and the margin of the Loe Pool (on the Weldron side) to Carminowe creek, and from thence by the boundary line of the said parish of Wendron up to the point first mentioned.

Cumberland.—The parishes of Whicham, and Millom, in the petty sessional division of Bootle, in the county of Cumberland.

Hampshire.—(1.) Those portions of the parishes of North Stoneham, and South Stoneham, in the county of Southampton, which are bounded on the south-east by the river Itchen, on the south-west by the road leading from Wood Mill through Burger Street to the Upper Common Gate, on the west by the Winchester road as far as the lane opposite Messrs. Bull and Son's farm, and on the north and north-east by the road leading past the Bishopstoke railway station to the river Itchen.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Bramley, in the petty sessional division of Basingstoke, in the county of Southampton.

Lancashire.—(1.) The township of Clayton-le-Dale, in the petty sessional division of Blackburn Lower, in the county of Lancaster.

(2.) The township of Samesbury, in the petty sessional division of Blackburn Lower, in the county of Lancaster.

(3.) The divisions of Low Quarter and Middle Quarter and a portion of Kirkby Moor bounded on the north by the road from Beanthwaite to Garthwaite, in the township of Kirkby Ireleth, in the petty sessional division of Lonsdale North, in the county of Lancaster.
