

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of two pieces of land, comprising together two roods and two perches (or thereabouts), which have been permanently secured to the vicarage of Hale, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Liverpool, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Hale, and to his successors, Incumbents thereof to meet the aforesaid benefaction, all and singular the yearly tithe commutation rent-charges which are particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and are now vested in us: To have and to hold the said yearly tithe commutation rent-charges to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the profits and proceeds of the said yearly tithe commutation rent-charges for and in respect of the period intervening between the seventh day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction of one thousand pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the consolidated chapelry and benefice of Saint Andrew, Ramsbottom, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, and of a further benefaction consisting of a piece or parcel of land comprising one thousand five hundred and seventy-five square yards (or thereabouts) which has been permanently secured to the same consolidated chapelry and benefice, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant to the Incumbent of the said consolidated chapelry and benefice of Saint Andrew, Ramsbottom, and to his successors, Incumbents thereof, to meet the aforesaid benefactions, one yearly sum or stipend of thirty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: And we do also, in further consideration of the aforesaid benefactions, hereby grant and appropriate out of our said common fund to the said consolidated chapelry and benefice of Saint Andrew, Ramsbottom, one capital sum of five hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said consolidated chapelry and benefice, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said con-

solidated chapelry and benefice of Saint Andrew, Ramsbottom: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments, sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend of thirty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said consolidated chapelry and benefice, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Highbridge, in the county of Somerset, and in the diocese of Bath and Wells, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of twenty-eight pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the fifth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of
