The following area (namely),—the parishes of Hardingstone, Wootton, Weston Favel, and Abington, in the county of Northampton, and the borough of Northampton,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-third day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.
