##### BYE-LAWS AS TO HOUSES LET IN LODGINGS.

(1.) *Harbour Light at Port Iviza.*

THE Spanish Government has given notice,  
 that on 13th December, 1881, a harbour light was  
 exhibited on the point (locally known as La Con-  
 signa) eastward of the town at Port Iviza, south-  
 east coast of Iviza Island.

The light shows green over the channel and  
 entrance to the port, and white towards the town.
