The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intima-tion from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. MR. WILLIAM HINTON, Inland Revenue Officer,

Halesowen, in recognition of the gallantry displayed by him under the following circumstances :

On the 13th January, 1881, a fire occurred on the premises of Mr. John Booth (an Ironmonger residing at Halesowen), in the basement of which a large quantity of oil was deposited.

A crowd of three or four hundred people had collected in front of the shop, and a rumour was current that gunpowder was also stored therein.

MR. HINTON having been informed of the locality in which the powder was placed, at once entered the burning premises, amidst dense volumes of smoke, and succeeded in removing therefrom a drawer containing several canisters of gunpowder.

On being told that a large quantity of blastingpowder was also within the building, MR. HINTON, at imminent risk to his life (for the fire was at this time raging fiercely) again entered into the shop, and returned with twenty-five pounds of such material.

The outside of the canister containing the powder was hot and blistered by flames, which were then in actual contact with it, and the heat was so intense that solder was melted on a number of articles which were at a greater distance fromthe fire than that at which it was found by MR. HINTON.

Those acquainted with the locality of the blasting-powder would not approach it ; and had not MR. HINTON, by this conspicuous act of gallantry, rescued it from the premises, in all human probability an explosion would have occurred, destroying a block of three buildings, and causing a great loss of life amongst those assembled.

WITH reference to the Notice which appeared in the London Gazette of the 15th November last, stating that empty grain bags carried by ships touching at a Spanish port should be declared in the ship's manifest, not as ship's stores, but as transit cargo, and in that part of the manifest which is vised by the Spanish Consul, the Board of Trade desire to call attention to the further condition that while any foreign or national vessel coming with cargo from foreign ports, and being of the burthen required for engaging in transit operations may call at a Spanish port to complete her lading with Spanish merchandise for a foreign destination, it is necessary that the effects already on board of such vessel be of a class admissible to entry at the port of call.

The text of the Spanish Customs' Ordinances, together with the appendix showing the classification of Spanish ports, and the description of imports and exports for which they are respectively habilitated may be consulted on application at the Commercial Department, Board of Trade, Whitehall Gardens.
