REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations

shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

PORT OF IPSWICH.

LIMITS OF PORT.

AND

PORT OF WOODBRIDGE,

ANNULLED.

WE, the undersigned, Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom

of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby, under the authority of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1876," appoint Ipswich, on and after the 1st day of April, 1882, to continue and be a Port in that part of the United Kingdom called England, and do hereby declare the limits of the said Port of Ipswich shall commence at the River Orwell, at a supposed straight line drawn between Shotley Point on the west side of the said river and Fagborough Head on the east side of the said river, being the boundary limit in the said river of the Port of Harwich, and shall continue up the said river and include both sides thereof to a certain lock called Handford Lock in the town of Ipswich, together with the docks, basins, quays, and wharves in the said town, and also including all other rivers, creeks, and harbours within the aforesaid limits, and further, that the seaboard limits of the said Port of Ipswich shall commence at the point of land on sand called the Platters, on the north-east side of Languard Fort, in the county of Suffolk, and rather more than a mile to the eastward of the said fort (that being the north-eastern seaboard limit of the Port of Harwich), and shall continue thence in a northerly direction along the coast of the county of Suffolk, to a place called Thorpe Ness, in the said county (being the southern limit of the Port of Lowestoft), and shall include all islands, rivers, bays, harbours, and creeks within the aforesaid seaboard limits, and shall extend seaward from low-water mark within the said seaboard limits to a distance of three miles.

And we, the said Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury do hereby, on and after the day and year before mentioned, annul all former limits of the Port of Ipswich, and all former limits of the Port of Woodbridge, and declare Woodbridge to be no longer a Port for Customs purposes.
