

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875 (38 Vic., c. 17).

Notice as to Fees for Licenses.

IN pursuance of Section 26 of the Explosives Act, 1875, and of Schedule 3 of the said Act, the Secretary of State for the Home Department has, with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, until further order, fixed the following to be the Fees payable in respect of Licenses, on and from the 1st April, 1882, in lieu of the Fees published in the London Gazette of 3rd December, 1875, and 1st April, 1879.

Original ...	£10, provided (a) that where the Secretary of State is of opinion that the scale of the proposed factory and the labour and time involved in the preparation of the license are such as to warrant a remission of a portion of the fee, such fee may be reduced to not less than £5; and (b) that in the case of a Toy Firework Factory the fee shall be 5s. Provided that where in the case of an amending license for a magazine licensed to contain an amount not exceeding 50,000lbs., it is proposed to increase the amount above 50,000lbs., the fee payable in respect of such amending license shall be the maximum authorised by the Act, viz., £5.
