to Welham on the north, and so much of the lands in the county of Northampton as lie within the following boundaries, that is to say, the London and North-Western railway on the east and south, and so much of the lands in the counties of Leicester and Northampton as lie within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from the point where the railway line crosses the Welham-road through Welham to the point at which the bridle-road enters the road from Welham to Slawston on the west.

(10.) So much of the parish of Warmington, in the county of Northampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the London and North-Western railway on the east, the village of Tansor on the south, the river Nen on the west, and the parish of Fotheringhay on the north.

Nottinghamshire.—(1.) So much of the parish of Tollerton, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, a line drawn from the Top farm of Alfred Broadhurst at Tollerton to the Glebes farm in the occupation of John Brunt at Tollerton, and from there to Johnsons field in the occupation of J. H. Sanders at Tollerton, and from there to the Rough field in the occupation of Samuel Wild at Tollerton.

(2.) So much of the parish of Cotgrave, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Grantham Canal, the highway leading from Cotgrave to Plumtree, the highway leading off the Cotgrave and Plumtree-road to Tollerton village, and the highway leading from Cotgrave to Holme-Pierrepont.

(3.) So much of the parishes of Kinoulton, and Owthorpe, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from Kinoulton to Widmerpool, a line drawn from Kinoulton Hill Top to New Fields farm in the occupation of Edwin Keyworth, and from thence to Winstow Gorse.

(4.) So much of the township of Brough, in the parish of North Collingham, in the county of Nottingham, as is comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on or towards the north by Norrell-lane, on or towards the east by a line leading from Mr. Barlow's farm to Norrell-lane, on or towards the south by Danethorpe-lane leading from Mr. Barlow's farm to the Foss-road, and on or towards the west by the Foss-road leading from Newark to Lincolu.

Rutland.—(1.) The parish of Thistleton, in the county of Rutland.

(2.) So much of the county of Rutland, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from the parish of Oakham Deanshold through Barleythorpe and Langham to Cold Overton, in the county of Leicester, on or towards the east and north, the said county of Leicester towards the west, and the parish of Oakham Deanshold aforesaid, and the road leading from the said parish to Knossington until it reaches the said county of Leicester on or towards the south.

(3.) So much of the parish of Lyndon, in the county of Rutland, as lies within the fol-lowing boundaries, that is to say, the river Gwash towards the north, the road leading from Lower Hambleton where it crosses the said river through Edith Weston and Lyndon to Pilton until it crosses the river Chater on the No. 25096.

east and south-east and part of the south, by the river Chater on or towards the remaining part of the south, and by the Midland railway on or towards the west.

(4.) The whole of the parish of Thorpe-by-

Water, in the county of Rutland.
(5.) So much of the parish of Liddington, in the county of Rutland, as lies between the parish of Thorpe-by-Water, and the following roads, that is to say, the road from Liddington to Gretton, Northamptonshire, and the road from Liddington to Thorpe-by-Water.

(6.) So much of the parish of Caldecott, in the county of Rutland, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Welland on the south, the road leading from Thorpe-by-Water to Rockingham railway station on the north and west, and the road from Liddington to Gretton on the east.

Shropshire.—(1.) So much of the parish of Lilleshall, in the county of Salop, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, His Grace the Duke of Sutherland's private drive from Lilleshall to Sheriff Hales, and the highway from Honnington to Sheriff Hales, and the Canal from Donnington Wood to Pave-lane.

(2.) So much of the parish of Sheriff Hales, in the county of Salop, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Lodge Wood and private road leading from thence to Lilleshall Abbey and to Lilleshall House, thence His Grace the Duke of Sutherland's drive to Sheriff Hales Manor, and thence to Lodge Wood aforesaid.

(3.) So much of the parish of Baschurch, in the county of Salop, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the water-course from Walford Heath to Fenemere brick-yard, thence the boundary fence which divides T. Slaney Eyton's property to the high-way leading from Merrington Green to Walford Heath watercourse aforesaid.

(4.) So much of the parish of Hinstock, in the county of Salop, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Lightwood-lane leading from the Woodseaves and Hinstock main-road to the Chester main-road at the Sweet Apple Tree, then the Chester main-road to the footroad at Hinstock Villa, then the foot-road from Hinstock Villa to the Woodseaves and Hinstock main-road, and thence to the end of Lightwoodlane at Mount Pleasant.

Staffordshire.—(1.) So much of the parish of Brewood, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from Gifford's Cross to Hyde Mill, by an imaginary straight line from Hyde Mill to the western end of Dirty-lane, by Dirtylane to the Wolverhampton-road, thence by the highway to Sandy-lane, by Sandy-lane to Hill Top, and by the highway from Hill Top to Gifford's Cross aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the parish of Brewood, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Stafford and Wolverhampton road from Gravelly Way Cross-roads to Standeford Bridge, thence by Saredon brook to the river Penk, by the river Penk to Stone Bridge, thence by the highway to Engleton Cross-roads, and by the highway from there through Crateford to Gravelly Way Cross-roads aforesaid.

(3.) Apesford farm in the township of Bradnop, in the county of Stafford, in the occupation of Samuel Bailey, together with the several farms in the occupation of George Tetterton,
