(4.) So much of the parishes of Stoke-upon-Trent, and Caverswall, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the main-road from Ash Hall to Withy Stakes, thence by the highway to Denman's Grave, thence by the road to Hanley Hays, and thence by the highway to Ash Hall aforesaid.

(5.) So much of the township of Marchington Woodlands, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Stock-lane from Danbridge Mill to the foot-road leading out of Stock-lane to Moat brook by that foot-road, thence by Moat brook to Danbridge Mill aforesaid.

(6.) So much of the parish of Brewood, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Wolverhampton and Stafford turnpike-road, from where it crosses the boundary of the parish of Brewood at Coren Heath, to the Canal Bridge at Slade Heath; thence by the Staffordshire and Worcestershire Canal to the boundary of the parish of Brewood at The Laches; and thence by that boundary southward to the aforesaid turnpike-road at Coven Heath.

(7.) So much of the township of Fazeley, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Tame from Bourne brook to Lady Bridge, thence by the turnpike-road from Tamworth to Sutton Coldfield as far as Bourne brook, and by Bourne brook to the river Tame aforesaid.

(8.) So much of the parish of Harborne, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the boundary of the borough of Birmingham by Greenfield-road, by the portion of High-street between the western end of that road and Moor Pool-lane, by Moor Pool-lane to the Moor Pool, thence by the brook flowing from that Pool to the boundary of the borough of Birmingham, and by that boundary to Greenfield-road aforesaid.

(9.) So much of the parishes of Betley, Audley, and Madeley, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from Betley village to Cook's Gate, thence by the highway which passes Heighley Castle to the turnpike-road from Madeley to Betley, and thence by that road to the first-mentioned highway at Betley village aforesaid.

*Suffolk.*—(1.) So much of the parish of Holbrook, in the county of Suffolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the out fall stream from Holbrook Fish Ponds on the north, the road from Holbrook Fish Ponds to Holbrook Sluice on the east, the river Stour on the south, and the Mill-stream running into the river Stour on the west.

(2.) So much of the parish of Harkstead, in the county of Suffolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Rence Park to Crouch House on the north, the lane known as Taylors-lane on the east, the road from Taylors-lane to Nimbletons Corner on the south, and the road from Nimbletons Corner to Rence Park on the west.

(3.) So much of the parish of Harkstead, in the county of Suffolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading

from Harkstead to Erwarton on the north, the watercourse from the said road leading to the river Stour at Beaumonts Hall on the east, another watercourse from the said road to the river Stour at a farm known as Knights farm in the occupation of Robert Kemball on the west, and by the river Stour on the south.

*Warwickshire.*—(1.) So much of the parish of Elmdon, in the county of Warwick, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Coventry turnpike-road on the north, Olton-road on the south, Elmdon-lane leading to Solihull on the east, and Olton-road leading to the Birmingham and Coventry-road on the west.

(2.) So much of the parish of Alveston, in the county of Warwick, as is bounded on or towards the west by the road leading from the ford on the river Avon into the Stratford and Wellesbourne-road in the village of Tiddington, and from thence on or towards the south by the said Stratford and Wellesbourne-road.

(3.) So much of the parish of Berkswell, in the county of Warwick, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Coventry and Berkswell-road on the south, Berkswell and Meriden-road on the west, and Four Oaks-lane on the north and north-east.

(4.) So much of the borough of Birmingham, and of the county of Worcester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Birmingham and Warwick canal on the north; Warwick-road, Greet, in the parish of King's Norton, from Anderton's-road to Golden Hillock-road on the south, Golden Hillock-road from canal bridge to Warwick-road on the east, and Anderton's-road as far as the said canal bridge from Sparkbrook-road on the west and north-west.

(5.) So much of the parish of Holy Trinity, in the county of Warwick, as lies within the following boundaries; that is to say, the road from Radford to Brownhill Green on the north, the Coventry and Nuneaton railway on the south, the Coventry and Fillongley-road on the east, and Coundon-lane on the west.

(6.) So much of the hamlet of Erdington, in the county of Warwick, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Midland railway on the south, Chester-road on the east, Grange-lane on the north, and the road leading from Bromford to Erdington on the west.

(7.) So much of the parish of Sheldon, in the county of Warwick, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Bacons End to File Cross, File Cross to Mackadown, Mackadown to Marston Green, Marston Green to Windyharbour, and Windyharbour to Bacons End.

(8.) So much of the parish of Allesley, in the county of Warwick, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Coventry and Birmingham-road on the south, Church-lane and Staircase-lane on the west, Lower Coundon-lane on the north, and Coundon-lane on the east.

(9.) So much of the parish of Yardley, in the county of Worcester, and of the parish of Aston, in the county of Warwick, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Church-road on the east, Hob-lane on the west, Coventry-road on the south, and Stetford-road on the north.

(10.) So much of the parish or township of Walsgrave on Sowe, in the county of Warwick, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Wythen-lane on the south and south-
