Cadix, November 7.

WE have advice by a Vessel come from Larache, that the Besieged, after having sustained 5 Assaults with great bravery, had, by the ill-condition they were reduced to, been forced to Capitulate; but that the General of the Moori not having Orders to grant the Terms they demanded, a Truce of four days had been agreed on, which time was thought sufficient for the sending a Messenger to the King of Morocco, and receiving his Directions thereupon. Some days ago arrived in this Bay two Spanish Gallies from Malaga with 200 Soldiers, who are kept on a Spanish Man of War; and yesterday came in here six Gallies commanded by the Duke of Turfis likewise with Soldiers, designed for the Relief of Oran; but it's feared they will come too late.

Rome, Novemb. 12. On the 30th past the Prince of Lichtenstem, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, had his first publick Audience of the Pope; and it's said that he is to continue here with the Character of Ambassador. The 2d, 3d, and 4th of this month the Cardinals of Goetz, Durazzo, and Borvish made their publick Entries into the City. The 6th Signior Landi, Envoy Extraordinary from Venice, had Audience of the Pope, and desired amongst other things, that the Republick might have leave to make Levies within the Ecclesiastical State for the War against the Turks, which will it's believed be granted. The 7th the Pope held a Consistory, where Don Pietro Orsboni, his great Nephew, was made a Cardinal. The 9th the Cardinal Salazar made his publick Entry. The same day was held a Congregation of State, composed of divers Cardinals, and it was resolved for the easing of the People, to lessen the Duties upon Corn. The 10th the Cardinals Borvish, Palavicino, Durazzo, Colaniz, Goetz, Radziouisky, Salazar, Finckenberg, and Orsboni, received the Cardinals Cap from the Pope in a publick Consistory. The French have restored Avignon.

Venice, Novemb. 18. We have advice from Dalmatia, that the Proveditore-General Molino had taken the Fortrels of Trebinie, a Post of great advantage to us, for that it secures the Communication between Garetta and Gabella. The Senate have ordered 3000 Men to be sent to Dalmatia, where they are to Winter, and in the Spring they will be transported to the Drees.

Genova, Novemb. 25. The great Council being assembled on the 12th Instant, it was resolved, in respect to the present Pope, that the Family of Orsboni shall enjoy all the Rights, Honours, and Privileges that belong to the Nobility of this State. The Governor of Malta has put some Troops into Guafalla, which are to remain there till the Forti-

fications are demolished. A Prince Philip William of Neubourg parted from hence yesterday for Milan.

Vicenza, Novemb. 17. On the 12th Instant arrived here an Express with Letters from Prince Louis of Baden of the 30th past, which gave an account, that Widen was pursuant to the Capitulation surrendered on the 19th, there marching out of the Castle 2500 Men able to bear Arms, with a great number of Women and Children; who had 200 Wagons allowed them, and a Convoy of 500 Horse to conduct them to Nicopolis; and that 5 Companies of the Regiment of Thingen were put into Garrison there, under the command of a Major. The 20th Prince Louis of Baden marched towards Ferislan, and encamped within half a mile of Florentin; The 21st he passed the River Trnock near Rabinnick; The 23d and 24th the Forces encamped at Prubice; On the 25th the Horse arrived at Fetslan; and the day following the Foot with the Baggage. The 27th they began to work on the Fortifications of the Castle, which had been ruined by the Turks; and the same day the Count de Schelche, who had been sent to the Prince and States of Valachia, returned with Deputies from them. The 28th the said Deputies had Audience of Prince Louis; but making some Difficulties about the Winter-Quarters he demanded for the Imperial Troops, they were sent back with this Declaration, That if the States of Valachia did not within six days comply with what he had proposed to them, he would cause part of the Army to march that way, to force them therunto; The 29th Prince Louis received an account from General Piccolomini, that he had possessed himself of Uscopia, and several other advantageous Posts on that side, but that he wanted a Reinforcement to execute his Design of advancing towards Sophia; Whereupon the Regiments of Serdu, Croy, and Hanouer, were ordered to join him; and were to begin their march the 31th. The Imperialists had laid a Bridge over the Danube at Feslan.

Ausbourg, Novemb. 29. The Elector of Trier is expected here the 27th of this Month; The Elector of Cologne on the 22th; And the Elector of Ratisla on the 24th. The Turkish Envoys at Vienna do earnestly demand the reaffirming the Treaty of Peace, but the Imperial Court will not proceed therein till the return of the Expresses that have been dispatched to Poland and Venice, to desire that Instructions may be sent to their Ministers here, in order to the renewing this Negotiation.

Frankfort, Novemb. 30. The Elector of Trier passed through this City on the 20th Instant in his Journey towards Ausbourg. General Fleming, who commands the Forces of Saxony, having had several Conferences with General Thunberg, and the Deputies of Meuse, about regulating their Winter-Quarters, parted from hence yesterday ago for Dresden, to give the Elector an account thereof. hear from *Dasil*, by Letters of the 17th Instant, that the Protestant Cantons were assembled at *Arrau*.

Cologne, Decemb. 2. On the 26th past arrived here some Troops of *Neubourg*; and more are expected, it being thought necessary to have a very good Garrison here this Winter to secure the Neighbouring Country against the Enemies Incursions. And it's said, that to cover the Country of *Juliers* several Dutch Regiments will repair the *Rhine*, and have Quarters assigned them there. We have an account by Letters from *Vienna* of the 24th past, that the Prince and States of *Valachia* had agreed with *Prince Louis* of *Baden* about the Winter-Quarters he demanded; and that they had likewise engaged themselves to furnish a considerable number of Horses for the recruiting the Imperial Cavalry against the Spring. That the Imperialists had laid a Bridge over the *Danube*; That they were going to raise several Forts on the Frontiers of *Valachia*, to hinder the Incursions of the Tartars; and that they worked very hard on the Fortifications of *Widin* and *Fetislin*.

Hamburg, Dec. 2. The Elector of *Brandenburg* returned to *Berlin* on the 18 of the last Month. The Duke of *Holftein* having taken some Swedish Troops into his Service, which the King of *Denmark* seems dissatisfied at, the Princes that employed their Mediation at the late Treaty of *Altena*, have, it's said, desired the Duke, for removing all Jealousie, to raise such Troops of his own as he has occasion for.

Brussels, Dec. 1. The Prohibition of French Goods is strictly look'd after in these Countreys; which makes the French very uneasy. On Sunday last an Envoy arrived here from the *Marschal d'Hamers*, who went the next day to *Amsterd.* (where our Governor-General now is) and had yesterday Audience of his Excellency; We do not yet know the particulars of his Message, but in general it's said to contain a Threatning, That if the above-mentioned Prohibition be not recalled, the French will waste the Spanish Territories with Fire and Sword. A Party of the Garrison of *Mons* met on Friday last a French Party, of whom they killed 20, and took the rest Prisoners. Another Party of 70 Men, belonging to *Newport*, has defeated 100 French; killing 11, and putting the rest to flight. The news of the burning the great Magazine at *Cambrai* is confirmed.

Hague, Decemb. 5. On the 28th past the *Heeren Van Engelsenburg, Witsen, Odyk, and Dickvelt*, Ambassadors Extraordinary of this State, arrived here from *England*; and the next day made report of their Embassy in the Assembly of the States-General. The *Baron de Bongars*, Envoy from the Electoral Prince *Palatine*, had this week a Conference, in which he desired, That the States would send some of their Forces to Winter in the Country of *Juliers*, for its security against the Incursions of the French. We have an account from *Zeland*, that Vice-Admiral *Van Purten* arrived at *Flushing* the 29th past, with the Ship under his command, but that the Ship of *Admiral Evertzen*, called the *Walkeren*, as she was coming in, (the Wind blowing fresh at South, and the Tide of Flood setting very hard) ran against the Head of the Haven, and made such a Leak, that she sunk presently after; but all the Men except a very few were saved, and they hope to recover all her Cannon. The Queen of *Spain* continues still at *Dort*.

Barnstable, Novemb. 26. On Saturday last was brought into *Lisford-Cove* (seven miles from hence) a French Vessel, which was taken by one of our Frigates on the Coast of *Ireland*, being laden with Iron and Hoops. Here is likewise arrived the *Terra Nova* of this place from *Newfoundland*; She met a French Privateer on the Coast of *Ireland*, with whom she exchanged several Broad-sides, and at last forced the Privateer to leave her.

Plymouth, Novemb. 26. There is come into this Port, since my last, a Dutch Privateer with a French Prize, laden with Sugar from the *West-Indies*. We hear from *Fowey*, that an English Privateer had brought in there 3 French

Prizes. Here is a very warm report, that a French Ship of above 200 Tuns, bound with Arms and Ammunition for *Ireland*, is forced aboard on the Bar of *Bladford*.

Whitehall, Novemb. 26. His Majesty has been pleas'd to Appoint *Thomas Paulson, Symon Manly, John Agar, Humphrey Gids,* and *James How*, his Majesties Commissioners for Visiting their Majesties Navy.

Whitehall, Decemb. 1. This day the King was pleas'd, as a Mark of His Royal Favour, to confer the Honour of Knighthood upon *Don Santiago del Castillo*, who is going to reside at *Jamaica* as Commissary General from the King of *Spain*, for supplying with Negroes the Spanish Dominions in the *West-Indies*.
