CEREMONIAL observed at the Marriage of His Royal Highness Leopold George Duncán Albert, Duke of Albany, Earl of Clarence, Baron Arklow, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Fourth Son of Her Majesty Queen Victoria and of His Royal Highness The Prince Consort, Duke of Saxony, and Prince of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, with Her Serene Highness The Princess Helen Frederica Augusta, Fourth Daughter of His Serene Highness The Reigning Prince of Waldeck and Pyrmont, in St. George's Chapel, Windsor, on Thursday, the 27th April, 1882.

The Ambassadors, Foreign Ministers, Cabinet Ministers and others invited to be at the Ceremony, arrived by Special Train from London and proceeded in Carriages provided for the purpose direct from the Windsor Terminus of the Great Western Railway to the South Entrance of St. George's Chapel, and were at once shown to the seats reserved for them in the Choir by Her Majesty's Gentlemen Ushers.

The Members of Her Majesty's Household in Waiting, who did not take part in the Carriage Processions, assembled at St. George's Chapel at half-past Eleven o'clock, arriving at the South Entrance.

The Archbishop of Canterbury, The Bishop of London (Dean of Her Majesty's Chapels Royal), The Bishop of Winchester (Prelate of the Order of the Garter), The Bishop of Oxford (Bishop of the Diocese and Chancellor of the Order of the Garter), The Bishop of Worcester (Clerk of the Closet), The Honourable and Very Reverend The Dean of Windsor (Lord High Almoner, Registrar of the Order of the Garter, and Domestic Chaplain to Her Majesty), with the Canons and Minor Canons of Windsor, assembled at the Deanery, and took their places within the Rails of the Altar at a quarter before Twelve o'clock, while a March was played on the Organ.
