The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Hereas His Majesty in Council was, on the 24th of October last, Graciously pleased to Order, that for some time no Custom, Excise, or other Duty whatsoever, should be Demanded, or Payabie in Ireland, for any of the Goods or Commodities in the Said Order mentioned, which skould be Imported thisher from this Kingdom. Now in regard the said Licence of Importation bath been abused; His Majesty in Council is this day pleased to Order, That the faid Exemption from paying of Custom; Excise, or other Duty, shall not continue longer than the First day of January ext en-suing smand that from the said First of January all Custom, Excise, and other Duty whatsoever, payable by Law, Ball to demanded and paid in such manner, as if the said Order, of the 24th of October, had not been made. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, and all other Persons to whom it may respectively appertain, are to give all necessary Orders, and to take Care, that His Majesties Pleasint berein be duly observed and put in Execution.

Dyet at Ratisbonne, to delire their Advice about the Affair of Saxe Lawenboirg; The State of which is briefly this: The Duke of Saxe Lawenboirg, who dyed lately, left only Two Danghters, to whomy by his Will, he gave all his Personal Estate, and what I and he had a his bound distinct the same distinct. what Lands he had at his own disposal! But as for the Dutchy of Saxe Lawenbourg; it being a Fief of the Empire, his next Heir Male has the Right of Succession; To which there are several Pretenders, as the Elector of Saxony, the Princes of Luinenburg, and the House of Anhault, whose Interest is supported by the Elector of Brandenburg. My Lord Paget, Envoy Extraordinary from His Maje fly of Great Britain, is arrived here; and the Emperor has named the Count de Coning seche to go in the same quality for England.

Ratisbonne, Novemb, 24. The States of the Empire affembled here, have deliberated in their feveral Colleges, upon what has been proposed to them by the Imperial Committioner, concerning the Succeffion of Saxe Lamenburgh, and particularly the Sequestration of that Dutchy into the Emperor's hands till the Matter be accommodated between the leveral Pretenders; but they have not yet taken any Resolution therein. The King of Sueden has affured the Emperor, that he will employ all his has altured the Emperor, that he will employ all his Interest in the Empire, for the furthering the Election of the King of the Romans; and his Minister here has given in a Memorial 10 the College of Electors for that purpose. It is said very considently, that a Marriage is concluded between Prince James, eldett Son of the King of Poland, and the youngest Princes of Neuroland

Berlin, Decemb. 2. The Count de Berka, the Imperial Minister, is arrived here from Hanouer, and has delivered to our Elector a Letter from the Entperor, wherein his Imperial Majesty invites him to-Authourg; But we do not yet hear what Answer his Electoral Highness has returned thereunto. The Sieur de Grumkom is gone with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from this Court to the Elector of Saxony.

Calegne, Decemb. 6. Several Conferences have been held here this week between the Generals of the Brandenburgh Forces, and the Deputies of this Diocese, about setting the Winter-quarters, and the Subfiltance for the Troops that are quartered at Mun, Duitz, Lintz, &c.
