

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Llangattock-juxta-Caerleon, in the county of Monmouth, and in the diocese of Llandaff, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all and singular the yearly tithes commutation rent-charges which are particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and are now vested in us: To have and to hold the said yearly tithes commutation rent-charges to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the profits and proceeds of the said yearly tithes commutation rent-charges for and in respect of the period intervening between the twenty-ninth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Lovington, in the county of Somerset, and in the diocese of Bath and Wells, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and twenty-two pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the vicarage of Saint Saviour, Herne Hill-road, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Rochester, one capital sum of two hundred and twelve pounds twelve shillings and four pence, such capital sum to be applied by us in discharging the amount payable to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne for the augmentation and maintenance of the Poor Clergy, under

a subsisting mortgage of the said vicarage, which was effected by a deed bearing date the thirty-first day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy, for the purpose of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage of Saint Saviour, Herne Hill-road.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Minister or Incumbent of the district of Saint Michael and All Angels, Croydon, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Canterbury, and to his successors, Ministers or Incumbents of the same district, one yearly sum or stipend of forty-eight pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said district, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
