The following area (namely),—within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Trent on the south from Barton Boat in the county of Nottingham to, and including a field known as Curzens Meadow at Long Eaton in the county of Derby in the occupation of John Sheperd, by a fence to Long Meadow-lane crossing the Midland railway to Clays Works, and on the east side of the Erewash railway, on the west to a point where the railway crosses the river Erewash into the county of Nottingham, on an occupation-road by John Hallax's farm in the parish of Toton, on the north to the Stapleford and Toton-road by a stream of water to the Nottingham-road by Moor Wood, by a fence in Harlys Field, on the east to a road leading to Attenborough by a fence dividing Mr. Holbrook's and Mr. Handburry's land and Mr. Holbrook's and Mr. Morriss's by a wire fence down to Barton Boat,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-eighth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Horton, Bart., to the river Trent, thence to the right along the river Trent to Drakelow Viaducts aforesaid.

And We do further by these presents authorise and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem expedient for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

And We do by these presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, may have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission, from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is, that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the several matters herein submitted for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in such matters We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved William Pole, Esq., Fellow of the Royal Society and Fellow of the Royal Society of Edinburgh, Member of the Council of the Institution of Civil Engineers, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Lisbon, announcing that by a Law of the Portuguese Government, dated the 7th instant, Tariff B, annexed to the Franco-Portuguese Treaty of the 19th December, 1881, as well as the rates of duties stipulated in the additional Convention to that Treaty of the 6th May of this year, are to be applied to the merchandize of any country, and that the Tariff in question will be in lieu of Tariff B of the Franco-Portuguese Treaty of the 11th July, 1866, the benefit of which was extended to Great Britain by the law of the 26th January, 1876.
