Hereas by an Order in Council bearing Date the Second Instant, His Majesty was pleased to Declare, That by reason of Abuses that have hapned upon the Licence given for Importing certain Commodities Duty fee Importing certain Commodities Duty f. ee into Ireland, the faid Licence flould be discontinued from and after the First of January next; since which time His Majesty having received the Petition of several Merchants of London, setting forth, That having lades several Visels with Provisions for His Majesties Subjects and Army in Ireland, which Visels being nowin the River of Thanes, would not probably arrive in Ireland before the First day of thomary which would be of creat detriment to thom, as January, which would be of great detriment to them, as having already paid their Customs due in England for the Sold Provisions. His Majesty in Council taking the fame faid Provisions. His Majesty in Council taking the same into His Gracious Consideration, is pleased to Order, That the Term allowed for the Importation of Provisions and Necessaries into Ireland Duty free by an Order in Council dated the 24th of October last, be continued and prolonged to the First of February next, pursuant to the said Order. And the Right Hamourable the Eards Commissioners of the Treasury, and all other persons to whom it may respectively apprecian, are to give the necessary Orders, and to take Care that His Majesties Pleasure herein be duly observed, and out in Execution. and put in Execution.

Rome, November 26. The Duke de Chautnes? Amballador of France, had the last week a private Audience of the Pope, to whom he delivered a Letter from the King his Master, containing a Renunciation of the Franchifes. The Prince of Liechtenstein has received Orders from the Emperor to continue here in the Quality of his Envoy Extraordinary, which he i acquainted the Pope with in an Audience he had of him on Wednesday, and at the same time presented a Letter from his imperial Majerly in answer to one which the Pope had writ to him with his own hand, The Pope has disposed of divers Governments, and has ordered, that those upon whom they are conferred, shall enjoy the whole Salary belonging to the fame, of whole the late Pope had

retrenched one half. On Friday laft arrived here Prince Antonio Octoboni, with his whole Family, from Venice, and was very simily received by the Pope; selvo defired; that he flouid make his Vifice to the Cardinals in the Hathrof Procurator of St.

Itemas, Decemb. 4. Yesterday, arrived here an Expansi from Bulgaria, with advice, That General Piccommini having possessed himself of Lescovaz, Pirot, Pristina, Oscopia, and several other places between Nissa and Sophia, and given Oiders for the fortifying the Pass of Kazanecke, he marched to Prisseran the chief City of Albania, and made a Treaty with that People, by which they put them. selves under the Emperors Protection; but the General, after having been there fome days, was frized with a violent Fever, of which he died; and the Duke of Holftein commanded the Imperial Porces in his flead. We hear likewise, that fix German Regiments are quartered in Valachia, and leveral others on the Frontiers towards Transi vumis. Prince Loun had ordered Novigrad to be fortified. and hed put into it a Garifon of 300 Men; And that he intended to make Prince Abatic a Ville, who had invited him to Hermanstad; and afterwards to return hither. It's faid that Count Guido of Searemberg is to command the Emperors Forces in Trainfi vania this Winter; Count Veterans in Valdebia;

and General Heister at Nissa. Menez, Decemb. 4. A Party of Huffars belonging to this Garison, who went out three daysago, have defeated a French Party, of whom they killed fix, and brought in here 21 Prisoners.

Ausbourg, Decemb. 5. All the Electors are now here, except thole of Brandenburg, and Saxony, to whom the Emperor is fending the Count of Salles burg. The Winter-Quarters are adjusted with the

States of the Circle of Suabia. Francfort, Decemb. 12. The Troops of Sayon that were quartered in these parts are marching home. The Imperialists fortify Hydelberg, and iome other places near the Rhines. As the French do Germersheim. The Mareschal de Lorge is at Soras.
