

King's Bromley Hays, the townships of Burntwood (including Edial and Woodhouses), and Curborough and Elmhurst, and so much of the parish of Cannock as lies on the eastern side of the highway from the boundary of the parish of Rugeley near Hednesford Pool through Hednesford and Heath Hays to Norton Common, all in the county of Stafford;—are hereby extended so as to include the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the second day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

#### SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising the petty sessional division of Elford, except the portion of the parish of Edingale which lies on the northern side of the highway from Lullington through Edingale village to Croxall; the petty sessional divisions of Rugeley, and Burton-upon-Trent, except the portion of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent situate within the latter division; the township of Newborough; such portions of the townships of Marchington, and Draycott-in-the-Clay, as lie to the east of the turnpike-road from Yoxall to Sudbury; the place called Staffordshire Moor; the township of Fazeley with its liberties; the townships of Swinfen and Packington, Wall, Pipehill, and Burntwood (including Edial and Woodhouses); the Chapeiry of Hammerwich, the parishes of Hopwas Hays, Ogle Hay and Farewell, and so much of the parish of Cannock as lies on the eastern side of the highway from the boundary of the parish of Rugeley near Hednesford Pool through Hednesford and Heath Hays to Norton Common, all in the county of Stafford; and the whole of the borough of Lichfield.

#### (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

**A**T the *Council Chamber, Whitehall*, the 1st day of September, 1882.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—so much of the township of Crompton, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary of the townships of Crompton and Butterworth from Whitfield Bottoms to Jep Wood on the north, the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway from Jubilee to Smallbrook on the east, the footpath to Lower and Higher Rushcroft on the south, and the footpath by Mossgate and Whitfield Hey to Whitfield Bottoms aforesaid on the west,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the second day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Acting Consul at Alexandria, stating that in consequence of the occurrence of cases of cholera at Aden and Cameran, on board of a vessel from Bombay, the Sanitary Board have decided to impose quarantine against arrivals from Bombay, and provisionally against Aden, pending further details; the quarantine to be seven days for infected vessels to be undergone at Tor, and in other cases according to a fixed scale, and to be undergone at Moses' Wells. Vessels eight days out to undergo only six days' quarantine, nine days out five days, and so on. Vessels taking thirteen days or upwards only to undergo twenty-four hours' observation.
