

into a bond to Her Majesty the Queen, in a sum not exceeding one thousand pounds, with or without a surety or sureties, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs, conditioned for the observance of the foregoing conditions; and

(b.) The master of the vessel has on each occasion of importation of foreign animals therein satisfied the Commissioners of Customs or their proper officer, by declaration made and signed or otherwise, that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions of this Article.

3. Nothing in the last foregoing Article shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under Article 103 of The Animals Order thereby revoked before the commencement of that Article or to interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, Article 103 of The Animals Order thereby revoked.

4. In this Order words have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

5. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-second day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.
