NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 171.)—South America.—Brazil. Light on Cape St. Thomé.

THE Brazilian Government has given notice, that on 29th July, 1882, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Cape St. Thomé.

The light exhibits white flashes every minute with total eclipses; it is elevated 157 feet above high water (148 feet above the ground), and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 19 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lonses of the first order.

The lighthouse, in the shape of a truncated cone and of a red colour, is supported on iron columns; the keeper's dwelling, painted white, is in the lower part of the structure.
