E have an account, That the Moors have taken the Town of Larache, with a great Slaughter of the Spaniards, who defended themselves with extraordinary Bravery, but being overpowered by the great number of fresh Troops which the Enemy still poured in upon them: Those of the Garison, that were lest, to the number of 4 or 500, retired into a small Caltle, where they capitulated: And, four Spanish Men of War, that were forced from thence by bad Weather, are ordered to return, with the first fair Wind, to bring them off. It's faid, we have lost above 1500 Men in the defence of this place.

Rome, Decemb. 3. The Pope held on Monday last a publick Consistory, where he resolved to grant an Universal Jubilee. Prince Antonio Ottoboni is made General of the Ecclesiastical State; and his Brother, Don Marco Ottobani, General of the Gallies. The Cardinal of Furstemberg parted from hence privately the last week: And the Cardinal d'Este is return'd to Modena. It's said the Pope will aitist the Venctians with five Regiments of Foot; one whereof is to be employ'd in Dalmatia, and the other

four in the Levant.

Venice, Nov. 26. On Sunday last the Procurator Cornaro, Proveditor-General at Sea, was chosen by the Great Council Captain-General of the Forces of the Republick in the Levant. By two Vessels come from Smirna we have an account, that the Turks had taken a Privatcer of Legborn, that was crinifing in the Archiepelago, being a Ship of 40 Guns, commanded by Paolo Barbieri, and had carried her to Constantinople. We hear from Dalmatia, that the Bassa of Arcegovina had attack'd, with 4000 Men, the Forts into which General Motino lately put Garifons on the Frontiers of the Province of Trebigny, and had obliged our Troops to furrender the fame, ripon condition to march out with their Arms and

Leghorne, Novemb. 28. By a Vesse' come lately from Argiers, we have the Confirmation of the French having made a Peace with that Government; but how Honourable the Terms of it are for the Crown of France, will appear by an Abstract of the Articles, which follows.

I. That the French shall refiore the five Algierine Men of War, which they took before the Declaration of the War, with their Men, Goods and Furniture.

II. That the French shall deliver to the Algierines as

many Turkish Slaves as there were Christians on Board the said Ships at the time of their Capture, or else shall pay 150 pieces of Eight per Head.

III. That the French shall pay for Cordogues Ship, burnt by their means before Oran, 50000 pieces of Eight, being a

new Ship of Forty Guns.

IV. The Curks that are Slaves in France shall be ransomed for 150, and the Moors for 100 pieces of Eight per

V. The Christians that are Slaves in Argiers are to agree hy. The constraint that are claves in regions are to agree mit before Patrons for their Liberty as well as they can youly those that were made such in time of Peace shall be free; and that Government shall give the French Societaction for Five small resident that were stack upon at Argiers as the time of the Peapture.

VI. The French shall not cruife on the Coast of Argiers on Forfesture of the Soups, that shall be taken cruising, there VII. The French Merchant Ships shall be visited by the alignment, who may take out of them what strangers

Algierines, who may take out of them what strangers they find on Board.

VIII. The Free th Men of War, so soon as they come to an Anchor before Angiers, are to salute the Town sief.

IX. A Considerable Quantity of Powder, Shot, Bombs, and six Mortax-pieces, are promised by the French for Present, as also an Engineer to fire them.

X. No Hostilizes to be committed after 22 days, reckoning from the day of the Signing of these Articles.

Vienna, Decemb. 8. The Duke of Hossein, harving, after the Death of General Piecelominis, takens ving, after the Death of General Piccolomini, taken upon him the Command of the Imperial Forces, he marched with his own Regiment, the Cuiraffiers of Hanouer, and the Huffars of Cziaki, to Orifat, and being there informed, that the Inhabitants of Suppo. who had some time before abandoned that place, were returned thither with their Wives and Children upon the report of the Imperialitts being gone into their Winter-quarters, he continued his march with great deligence, and came the roth of the last month within fight of the Town; a Party of about 60 Germans and Huffars, that was ordered to advance to observe the potture of the Enemy, found their Vanguard, being about 300 Men, advantageously posted not far from the place, with whom the skinnished till the Lieutenant-Colonel of Henouer came to their Affiltance with two Squadrons; the Turks made a good defence, but were at last beaten from their Post with the loss of 50 of their Men kill'd. upon the place. This occasioned a great alarm in the Town; and the Bassa of Uscopia, who, upon the News of our march, had drawn what force he could together, advanced towards us with 600d Men; but our Forces charged them with that Vigor, that they foon put them into Confusion. The Ene my fled, and our Men pursued them above an hour, killing 2000, and taking many Prisoners; with the loss on our fide of about 70 Men; Our Troops entred the Town, and, after some oppo-fition from the Inhabitants, made themselves Matters of it; the Plunder thereof was given to the Soldiers; and the Town, not being tenable, was afterwards burnt. From thence our Forces marched towards Czemet, and met a Party of 300 Turks, who had been fent towards Ofcopia, and knew nothing of our march, of whom they kill'd 150, the rest flying to the Mountains. This account we have by Letters written at Czomet the 11th of the Laff month.

Ausbourg, Decemb. 10. On the fourth instant. my Lord Paget, Envoy Extraordinary from his Majesty of Great Britain, had his first Audience of the Emperor and the Empress; and the 7th of the King of Hungary, being conducted thereunto with the accustomed Ceremonies.
