THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Areas (namely), — (1.) so much of the parish of Great Limber, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Great Limber to Kirmington on the north, the highway leading from Great Limber to Grasby on the south and east, and by certain gardens in the occupation of Plaskitt and Abbott on the west, and (2.) so much of the parish of Caistor, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Caistor to Brigg on the east, the occupation-road leading out of the said highway to Sand Braes on the south, the hedge dividing a corn-field and grass-field in the occupation of John Anson on the west, and the hedge between the Brick-yard in the occupation of Thomas Ringrose and a certain farm in the occupation of Benjamin Marshall on the north, — which were declared by Orders of Council dated respectively the nineteenth and twenty-sixth days of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.
