(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 4th day of October, 1882.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—so much of the parish of Wilford, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, a certain road known as Wilford-lane leading from the Old Toll Bar to Wilford blacksmith's shop on the north-west, Ruddington-road to Landmear-lane on the south, Landmear-lane to Loughborough-road on the east, and Loughborough-road to the Old Wilford Toll Bar on the north,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—the whole of the buildings and land in the occupation of Thomas Coates at Southcoates, in the borough of Kingston-upon-Hull, bounded on the north by the Holderness-road, on the south by land in the occupation of George Foster, on the east by land in the occupation of David Smith, and on

the west by land in the occupation of William Rogerson, — which was declared by Order of Council dated the eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Decree of the Portuguese Government, establishing regulations with a view of checking the ravages of the phylloxera in the wine-growing districts of Portugal. As regards imports from foreign countries it is decreed that vine-stocks, cuttings, and sprigs, or any other parts of vines can only be introduced from abroad into such districts of Portugal as are declared to be completely infected with phylloxera, or where the vines are quite destroyed. Importations of this nature can only take place at the Custom-houses of Lisbon, Oporto, and Funchal, or at such other places as the Government may hereafter designate. The produce imported must be packed in wooden cases, tightly screwed down, and must be accompanied by a document stating the contents of the cases, and for what district they are intended. Should the above rules be infringed, the consignments will be seized and burnt. Agricultural and garden products may be imported without restriction, except in the case of roots and tubers with earth adhering, which must be accompanied by the certificate of a competent authority that they do not proceed from plantations or fields interposed between phylloxerated vines. Trees, shrubs, and plants may also be admitted if certified as not coming from a phylloxerated territory. If, however, such articles come from a phylloxerated territory, they may be admitted into an infected district without restriction, but they will be excluded from districts free from infection, unless accompanied by the following documents:—

1. A declaration of the sender, duly signed, stating that the articles are the exclusive product of his establishment, and designating the place to which they are being sent, and the name of the consignee.

2. A certificate by a competent authority—

(a.) That the articles come from a plot of ground separated from the nearest vine plant by a space of at least 20 metres, or by such obstacle as the competent authority may judge sufficient to isolate the vine roots.

(b.) That the plot itself contains no vine plant.

(c.) That no vine plant or portion thereof has recently been deposited on such plot.

(d.) That if phylloxerated vines have been thereon, the roots have been torn up, the proper poisons have been applied, and that during three years investigations have been made which assure the complete destruction of the insect and the roots.

The articles must be well packed and the roots covered, but so as to allow inspection. If any trace of phylloxera is discovered, the articles will be immediately destroyed.
