

**The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.**

In the County Court of Yorkshire, holden at Sheffield. In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against Ernest Albert Lynde, of Sheffield, in the county of York, Architect and Surveyor.

UPON the hearing of this Petition this day, and upon proof satisfactory to the Court of the debt of the Petitioner, and of the act of Bankruptcy alleged to have been committed by the said Ernest Albert Lynde having been given, it is ordered that the said Ernest Albert Lynde be, and he is hereby, adjudged bankrupt.—Given under the Seal of the Court this 6th day of October, 1882.
